- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 48-01.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code
- 2 relating to plans and specifications for public improvement contracts.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 48-01.1-04 of the 1995 Supplement to the North 5 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 48-01.1-04. Plans and specifications for public improvement contracts.
- <u>1.</u> If the estimated cost of the public improvement is in excess of one hundred thousand dollars, a governing body shall procure plans, drawings, and specifications from a licensed architect for the construction of any public building 10 that has as its principal purpose human occupancy, habitation, or use, or the 11 space within and surrounding the public building, for buildings in the following 12 occupancy categories as defined in the uniform building code adopted under 13 section 54-21.3-03:
  - All use groups A, E, H, I, and R-3. a.
    - b. All use groups B, F-1, M, S-1, S-3, and S-5 buildings greater than twelve thousand square feet [1114.8 square meters].
    - All use group R-1 greater than eighteen thousand square feet [1672.2 square C. meters] or greater than three stories in height.

Plans, drawings, and specifications for interior building renovations primarily of structural, mechanical, or electrical systems of inhabited structures may be performed by a registered professional engineer as allowed by the state board of registration for professional engineers and land surveyors, provided these renovations do not change occupancy loads or classifications, access or exit

24 patterns, or uniform building code requirements.

2. If a contract of a governing body for the construction of a public improvement not intended for human habitation is estimated to cost in excess of fifty one hundred thousand dollars, the governing body shall procure plans, drawings, and specifications for the work from a licensed architect or registered professional engineer. A public improvement may not be phased or broken into small projects to avoid the provisions of this section. For public buildings in use by or to be used by the North Dakota agricultural experiment stations in connection with farm or agricultural research operations, the plans, drawings, and specifications may, with the approval of the board of higher education, be procured from a registered professional engineer if the engineer is in the regular employment of the agricultural experiment station.
