- A concurrent resolution urging the State Department of Health to utilize its rulemaking authority to strengthen the remediation and long-term liability requirements for solid waste disposal.
 - **WHEREAS**, the management and disposal of solid waste is a complex social problem that impacts surface and ground water, air quality, land values, roads, and many other aspects of the lives of North Dakota citizens relating to health, safety, and the environment; and
 - **WHEREAS**, state and local governments face issues involving potentially large cleanup costs and other potential liabilities for remediation after the closure of solid waste landfills in this state as that, for example, faced by the city of Minot in a superfund action involving that city; and
 - **WHEREAS**, the citizens of North Dakota have expressed the desire that the issues of remediation and long-term liability for solid waste disposal be addressed; and
- WHEREAS, the Environmental Health Section of the State Department of Health has
 done an excellent job conducting its solid waste program and enforcing its solid waste
 standards; and
 - **WHEREAS**, the State Department of Health has rulemaking authority to address issues of remediation and long-term liability for solid waste disposal;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

- That the Fifty-fifth Legislative Assembly urges the State Department of Health to utilize its rulemaking authority to strengthen the remediation and long-term liability requirements for solid waste disposal; and
