Narrative:

The bill revises the entire games of chance law to make the law clear and concise. The bill restricts prizes for games conducted under a local permit, prohibits a city or county governing body from issuing a conditional site authorization, provides an exception to the limit on the number of sites, increases allowable expenses for security equipment, enables a chamber of commerce to apply net proceeds to promote tourism, authorizes the Attorney General to waive any minimal tax, repeals licensing of a manufacturer's distributor, and authorizes the Attorney General to require a person to attend training, or prohibit a person from being involved in gaming or providing services to an organization or distributor.
