Revenue from fines imposed in criminal cases are transmitted by county auditors for deposit in the common schools trust fund. Fine revenue is not segregated and identified as resulting from a misdemeanor or felony offense; nor is a single amount per offense reported. Therefore, the fiscal impact of increasing the maximum allowable fine in misdemeanor cases is unknown.
