Date of Request: March 13, 1997

1. Please estimate the fiscal impact (in dollar amounts) of the above measure for state general or special funds, counties, cities, and school districts.

Narrative: This bill relates to calculating the actual transportation costs for the first year a school district that formerly contracted for its bus transportation services begins to provide its own transportation services.

Reimbursement for transportation costs is limited to 90% of the school district's operating expenditures plus the eight year average cost of transportation equipment. In the 1996-97 school year, 36 of 236 school districts were subject to the 90% transportation cap. The average amount of the cap was \$4,200. Only 5 of the 36 districts contracted for their bus services.

We estimate that the fiscal impact of this bill to be less than \$5,000 per year (\$10,000 per biennium).
