Date of Request: January 15, 1997

1. Please estimate the fiscal impact (in dollar amounts) of the above measure for state general or special funds, counties, cities, and school districts.

Narrative: This bill reduces the length of the school year from 180 days to 170 contact days. This changes the calculation base for average daily membership (ADM) from 180 days to 170 days, but does not affect the overall ADM calculation (which is basically the percentage of time a student was in attendance during the school year expressed in units).
 The impact on local school districts is not measurable. The bill reduces actual contact days from 173 (180 minus 2 NDEA, 2 parent/teacher days, 3 holidays) to 170. Salaries and benefits make up roughly 80% of overall district costs and are for the most part fixed by contract. Savings in plant operation costs for three days is not expected to be significant.
 This bill is expected to have no fiscal impact.
