## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2333

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-38 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to teacher certification requirements; and to provide an appropriation.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
5 created and enacted as follows:

6 **Teacher certification - National teacher's examination.** As a condition of initial  
7 certification, the education standards and practices board shall require that an applicant pass  
8 the basic portion of the national teacher's examination. As a condition of the first two-year  
9 recertification, the education standards and practices board shall require that an applicant pass  
10 the full national teacher's examination. The education standards and practices board shall  
11 place any teacher who fails to pass the national teacher's examination for the first two-year  
12 recertification on probation for a period of six months. If within that time the individual seeking  
13 recertification is not able to successfully pass the national teacher's examination, the board  
14 shall deny recertification. An applicant for initial certification or the first two-year recertification  
15 must bear the cost of the national teacher's examination.

16 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.**

17 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state  
18 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,000,000, or so much of the  
19 sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the  
20 purpose of awarding teacher professional development grants to school districts,  
21 for the biennium beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2001.

22 2. a. Each school district is entitled to receive a grant as provided in this Act not  
23 exceeding \$50,000, provided the district submits an application to the

- 1 superintendent of public instruction outlining its proposal for expending the  
2 funds and the superintendent approves the application.
- 3 b. The superintendent of public instruction may not approve an application for  
4 grant funds unless the application includes specific information regarding the  
5 type of teacher professional development activities to be provided, how the  
6 provided activities will contribute to the implementation of the district's  
7 comprehensive professional development plan, the time, place, and manner  
8 in which the activities will be provided, a list of participants and presenters, a  
9 list of specific teacher, school, and school district needs to be addressed and  
10 a description of the manner in which the activities will meet these needs, and  
11 the method to be used for assessing both the teacher professional  
12 development activities and any changes in teacher effectiveness and student  
13 learning resulting from the activities.
- 14 c. The superintendent of public instruction may develop additional criteria for the  
15 approval of grant applications under this section.
- 16 3. No teacher professional development activities funded under this Act may take  
17 place during hours of classroom instruction that are counted toward a full day of  
18 instruction for purposes of foundation aid.
