

1. Narrative: *The bill allows the Public Service Commission to randomly check price scanners for accuracy. Testing will be done by present Public Service Commission staff as they do their other duties. There will be no effect on the General Fund. Testing will be done mainly in response to complaints. Even though the bill proposes a \$10 testing fee, the number of tests will not be significant so that the revenues raised are expected to be minimal.*
