1. Please estimate the fiscal impact (in dollar amounts) of the above measure for state general or special funds, counties, cities, and school districts.

Narrative: Section 1 of the bill creates a new requirement for the lead foodservice worker in every school and child care preparation site to be trained in foodservice sanitation and safety. There will be some fiscal impact at the local level associated with training costs (salary, travel, course registration). There will be minimal fiscal effect at the state level. The Department expects to offer the necessary coursework for foodservice employees at no or minimal cost to the school/child care center participant. This can be done as a continuation or extension of current training efforts of the agency.

Section 2 of the bill repeals a requirement of local agencies. The current requirement is estimated to cost \$30,000 per year statewide.
