- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact six new sections to chapter 15-47 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code or in the alternative to create and enact six new sections to chapter 15.1-21 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the testing of reading and mathematics.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, a new section to chapter 15-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Reading and mathematics - Administration of test. Beginning during the second half of the 2001-02 school year and annually thereafter, the superintendent of public instruction shall administer to students in grades four, eight, and twelve a test that is aligned to the state content standards in reading and mathematics.

SECTION 2. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, a new section to chapter 15-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Test scores - Compilation. The superintendent of public instruction shall arrange for the compilation of test scores in a manner that indicates both aptitude and achievement and allows a comparison of individual students, classrooms within a given school and school district, schools within the state, and school districts within the state. The test scores must also allow for comparisons based on students' gender, ethnicity, economic status, service status, and assessment status, unless doing so enables the identification of any student.

SECTION 3. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, a new section to chapter 15-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Test scores - Publication. Upon receiving notice that the compilation of test scores has been completed, the superintendent of public instruction shall inform the legislative council.

If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, a new section to 12 chapter 15-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 13 Professional development - Use of available funds. 14 On or before October first of each year, each school district shall file a professional development plan with the superintendent of public instruction. The plan must 15 16 include: 17 The amount and source of funds that were made available to the district for a. 18 professional development during the preceding school year; 19 b. The amount and source of funds that were expended by the district for 20 professional development during the preceding school year; 21 The number of district teachers who participated in professional development C. 22 activities during the preceding school year; 23 d. The source of funding for the professional development activities in which the 24 teachers participated during the preceding school year; and 25 The nature and scope of the professional development activities in which the e. 26 teachers participated. 27 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall compile the information submitted 28 under this section to determine how much of the available funding for professional

development was used by school districts in this state and, beginning with the

reports due on or before October 1, 2002, whether the expenditure correlated with

1	increased student achievement on the reading and mathematics tests required by
2	section 1 of this Act.
3	SECTION 6. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, a new section to
4	chapter 15-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
5	Content standards - Translation - Curriculum. Each district shall provide upon
6	request a copy of its content standards in the areas of reading and mathematics, a translation
7	of the district's content standards in the areas of reading and mathematics for individuals who
8	do not have a background in elementary or high school education, and a copy of the curriculum
9	or syllabus used by each teacher of reading and mathematics.
10	SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	created and enacted as follows:
12	Reading and mathematics - Administration of test. Beginning during the second half
13	of the 2001-02 school year and annually thereafter, the superintendent of public instruction shall
14	administer to students in grades four, eight, and twelve, the comprehensive test of basic skills,
15	or a comparable nationally normed test, in the areas of reading and mathematics. Any test
16	used to fulfill the requirements of this section must be aligned to the state content standards in
17	reading and mathematics.
18	SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	created and enacted as follows:
20	Test scores - Compilation. The superintendent of public instruction shall arrange for
21	the compilation of test scores in a manner that indicates both aptitude and achievement and

SECTION 11. A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Professional development - Use of available funds.

- 1. On or before October first of each year, each school district shall file a report with the superintendent of public instruction indicating:
 - The amount and source of funds that were made available to the district for professional development during the preceding school year;
 - The amount and source of funds that were expended by the district for professional development during the preceding school year;
 - c. The number of district teachers who participated in professional development activities during the preceding school year;
 - d. The source of funding for the professional development activities in which the teachers participated during the preceding school year; and
 - e. The nature and scope of the professional development activities in which the teachers participated.
- 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall compile the information submitted under this section to determine how much of the available funding for professional development was used by school districts in this state and, beginning with the reports due on or before October 1, 2002, whether the expenditure correlated with increased student achievement on the reading and mathematics tests required by section 7 of this Act.

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- **SECTION 12.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- Content standards Translation Curriculum. Each district shall provide upon
 request a copy of its content standards in the areas of reading and mathematics, a translation
 of the district's content standards in the areas of reading and mathematics for individuals who
 do not have a background in elementary or high school education, and a copy of the curriculum
 or syllabus used by each teacher of reading and mathematics.
