- 2 Century Code, relating to pharmacist administration of drugs; and to amend and reenact
- 3 subsection 1 of section 43-15-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to terms used by
- 4 the board of pharmacy.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-15-01 of the 1999 Supplement 7 to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 8 "Administration" means the direct application of a drug to the body of a patient. 1. 9 The term includes the: a. 10 (1) The emergency maintenance of a drug delivery device used in home 11 infusion therapy by a qualified home pharmacist when nursing service 12 is not available: ; 13 (2)Immunization and vaccination by injection of an individual who is more than eighteen years of age, upon an order by a physician or nurse 14 15 practitioner authorized to prescribe such a drug or by written protocol 16 with a physician or nurse practitioner; and Provision of drugs by subcutaneous, intradermal, and intramuscular 17 <u>(3)</u> 18 injection to an individual who is more than eighteen years of age upon 19 the order of a physician or nurse practitioner authorized to prescribe
  - b. The term excludes does not include the regular ongoing delivery of a drug to the patient in a health care setting and other parenteral administration of a drug.

ı	<b>SECTION 2.</b> A new section to chapter 43-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
2	created and enacted as follows:		
3	Injection of drugs - Rules. Any pharmacist who administers drugs by injection must		
4	have a certificate of authority from the board. The authority to administer a drug by injection		
5	may not be delegated. The board shall adopt rules to establish educational and operational		
6	requirements for a pharmacist to obtain and maintain a certificate of authority to administer		
7	drugs by injection. Rules adopted by the board under this section must include:		
8	<u>1.</u>	Educational requirements of a minimum of twenty hours, which include, at a	
9		min	<u>imum:</u>
10		<u>a.</u>	Basic immunology, including the human immune response;
11		<u>b.</u>	The mechanism of immunity, adverse effects, dose, and administration
12			schedule of available vaccines and approved medication and immunization;
13		<u>C.</u>	Current immunization guidelines and recommendations of the centers for
14			disease control and prevention;
15		<u>d.</u>	Management of adverse events, including identification, appropriate
16			response, documentation, and reporting;
17		<u>e.</u>	How to educate patients on the need for immunizations;
18		<u>f.</u>	Physiology and techniques for subcutaneous, intradermal, and intramuscular
19			injection; and
20		<u>g.</u>	Recordkeeping requirements established by law, rule, and regulation or
21			established standards of care.
22	<u>2.</u>	A re	equirement that an authorized pharmacist must obtain and maintain current
23		<u>cert</u>	ification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or basic cardiac life support.
24	<u>3.</u>	Rec	uirements to maintain continuing competency with completion of a minimum of
25		six l	nours of education dedicated to this area of practice every two years.
26	<u>4.</u>	Requirements for content of physician orders and protocols.	
27	<u>5.</u>	Requirements relating to the reporting of the administration by injection to a	
28		pati	ent's primary health care provider and to the state department of health.
29	<u>6.</u>	Rec	uirements relating to environments in which injections may be administered.
