- 1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the separation of powers
- between the legislative and judicial branches and the distinction between the responsibilities of
 each branch.
 - **WHEREAS**, Section 26 of Article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota provides that the legislative, executive, and judicial branches are co-equal branches of government; and
- WHEREAS, with the exception of the power of the people to propose and enact laws by
 the initiative, the sole legislative power of the state is vested in the Legislative Assembly; and
 - **WHEREAS**, due to judicial activism and the apparent desire of courts throughout the judicial system in this country to engage in legislating from the bench, the powers of the legislative branch of government have been encroached upon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

- That the Legislative Council study the separation of powers between the legislative and judicial branches and the distinction between the responsibilities of each branch;
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly.
