1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to raise the level of federal funding for the education of 2 children with disabilities. 3 WHEREAS, Congress has enacted legislation to ensure that all children with disabilities 4 have available to them a free appropriate public education, to protect the rights of children with 5 disabilities and their parents or quardians, to assist states and localities in providing for the 6 education of all children with disabilities, and to assess and ensure the effectiveness of efforts 7 to educate children with disabilities; and 8 WHEREAS, although Congress has declared that state and local education agencies 9 have a responsibility to provide education for all children with disabilities, state and local 10 financial resources are inadequate to meet the special education needs of children with 11 disabilities; and 12 WHEREAS, on November 19, 1975, Congress enacted the Education For All 13 Handicapped Children Act, which, after being amended in 1991, is known as the Individuals 14 With Disabilities Education Act; and 15 WHEREAS, Congress included a graduated formula for determining state entitlement 16 and provided that for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1982, and for each fiscal year 17 thereafter, the federal funding level was to be set at 40 percent of the average per student 18 expenditure in public elementary and secondary schools in the United States; and 19 WHEREAS, the level of federal funding received by this state for the education of 20 children with disabilities has never exceeded 11 percent; and 21 WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of North Dakota supports the goal of providing full

WHEREAS, budget surpluses in recent years could be used to raise the level of federal funding for special education;

educational opportunity to all children with disabilities and recognizes that in meeting this goal,

many school districts in the state incur financial hardships; and
