- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-24.5-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the powers of the department of human services relating to the aid to aged, blind,
- 3 and disabled persons program.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-24.5-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## **50-24.5-02.** Powers and duties of the department. The department shall:

- Administer aid to vulnerable aged, blind, and disabled persons and supervise and direct county agencies in the administration of aid to vulnerable aged, blind, and disabled persons.
- Supplement, within the limits of legislative appropriation, the income of an eligible beneficiary receiving necessary adult family foster care services to the extent that the eligible beneficiary lacks income sufficient to meet the cost of that care provided at rates determined by the department.
- Supplement, within the limits of legislative appropriation, the income of an eligible beneficiary receiving necessary basic care services to the extent that the eligible beneficiary lacks income sufficient to meet the cost of that care, provided at rates determined by the department.
- 4. Pay qualified service providers at rates determined by the department, within the limits of legislative appropriation, for the provision of the following services provided to an eligible beneficiary to the extent that the eligible beneficiary lacks income sufficient to meet the cost of these services:
- a. Homemaker services;
- b. Chore services;

- 1 Respite care; C. Home health aide services; 2 d. 3 Case management; e. 4 f. Family home care; 5 g. Personal attendant care; 6 h. Adult family foster care: 7 i. Adaptive assessment; and 8 į. Other services the department determines to be essential and appropriate to 9 sustain an individual in the individual's home and community and to delay or 10 prevent institutional care. 11 5. Establish, maintain, and ensure the enforcement of standards for congregate 12 housing as may be appropriate to the needs of the residents of congregate housing 13 who are receiving services under this chapter. The standards must govern matters 14 such as admission policy, safety, sanitation, and protection of civil rights. 15 6. Establish an individualized care rate for each eligible beneficiary receiving adult 16 family foster care services or assisted living services. 17 7. Establish annually per diem rates and limits on actual allowable historical costs 18 based on cost reports for all basic care facilities participating in the basic care 19 assistance program. The limits established by the department may not be less 20 than the per diem rate for the eightieth percentile bed in each cost category. In 21 determining allowable historical cost per diems for purposes of establishing limits 22 and payment rates, the department shall divide allowable historical costs by the 23 actual number of resident days, except when a facility is occupied at less than 24 ninety percent of licensed capacity days, the department may establish procedures 25 to adjust the computation of the per diem to an imputed occupancy level at or 26 below ninety percent. The department may combine one or more cost categories 27 and may use different methods for calculating the per diem rate for each cost 28 category or combination of cost categories.
  - 8. Issue payment to basic facilities and adult family foster care facilities for services provided to an eligible beneficiary.
  - 8. 9. Take action and give directions necessary to implement this chapter.
