- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 50-24.3-01 and 50-24.3-03 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the provision of targeted case management by the
- 3 department of human services; and to provide an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-24.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 50-24.3-01. Assessment mechanism Establishment Targeted case management.
- 8 The department of human services shall establish a mechanism to assess, prior to admission
- 9 to a skilled nursing facility, intermediate care facility, or a hospital swing-bed facility approved to
- 10 furnish skilled or intermediate care services, the health and social needs of each person
- 11 making application for admission to the facility targeted case management service for disabled
- 12 and elderly individuals eligible for benefits under chapter 50-24.1 who are at risk of requiring
- 13 long-term care services to ensure that an individual is informed of alternatives available to
- 14 address the individual's long-term care needs.
- 15 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-24.3-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 16 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 **50-24.3-03. Department of human services Powers and duties.** The department
- 18 of human services has the following powers and duties which it may delegate to any entity
- 19 which provides assessment services targeted case management services approved by the
- 20 department:
- 21 1. To seek cooperation from other public and private agencies entities in the
- 22 community which offer services to disabled and elderly persons individuals with
- 23 disabilities or the elderly.

1 To provide information and education to the general public regarding availability of 2 the assessment program targeted case management. 3 3. To accept referrals from an interested party including individuals, families, human 4 services program professionals, and nursing home facility personnel, and acute 5 care facility personnel. 6 To assess the health and social needs of, and provide targeted case management 7 to, referred individuals who wish to receive this service. 8 5. To identify available noninstitutional services to meet the needs of referred 9 individuals. 10 To prepare recommendations for individuals receiving assessment program 11 services as to the need for skilled nursing care, or intermediate care as provided in 12 a facility, or other care which is available in the community an individual care plan 13 for each individual receiving targeted case management services. 14 7. To inform referred individuals of the extent to which home long-term care services 15 are available, including institutional and community-based services are available, 16 and of their the individual's opportunity to choose, in consultation with an attending 17 physician and, family member members, and other interested parties, among the 18 appropriate alternatives that may be available.

To monitor the results of targeted case management and report to each legislative

assembly on these results and the cost-effectiveness of these services.
