- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for curricula aligned to content standards in all schools; to amend
- 2 and reenact section 15.1-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the approval of
- 3 schools; and to repeal sections 15-38-07, 15-38-08, 15-38-09, 15-38-10, 15-38-11, and
- 4 15-38-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to required school curricula.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. Required academic content standards in all schools. To be approved
- 7 by the superintendent of public instruction, each public and nonpublic school shall adopt or
- 8 <u>develop curricula aligned to the state academic content standards for all core subject areas</u>
- 9 applicable to grades four, eight, and twelve. The superintendent of public instruction shall
- 10 ensure that students receive education in the core subject areas of:
- 1. English language arts, including reading, writing, speaking, and listening.
- 12 2. Mathematics.
- 3. Social studies, including the Constitution of the United States and United States
  history, geography, and government.
- 15 <u>4. Science, including agriculture.</u>
- 16 5. Physical education.
- 17 <u>6. Health, including physiology, hygiene, disease control, and the nature and effects</u>
  18 of alcohol, tobacco, and narcotics.
- 19 **SECTION 2. State academic content standards Development.** The superintendent
- 20 of public instruction shall develop and distribute to each school district and nonpublic school
- 21 <u>state academic content standards for all core subject areas applicable to grades four, eight, and</u>
- 22 twelve. The superintendent of public instruction shall revise the state academic content
- 23 standards required by this section at least once every five years and distribute the revised
- 24 standards to each school district and nonpublic school.

1 Beginning with the 2004-05 school year, the superintendent of public instruction 2 shall require that each school district and nonpublic school shall adopt or develop 3 curricula for grades four, eight, and twelve which are aligned to the academic 4 content standards in the areas of health and physical education. 5 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-06 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 6 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 7 15.1-06-06. Approval of public and nonpublic schools. Each public and nonpublic 8 school in this state offering elementary or secondary education to students must be approved 9 by the superintendent of public instruction. Except as otherwise provided by law, the 10 superintendent may not approve a school unless: 11 Each classroom teacher holds a valid teaching certificate issued by the education 12 standards and practices board; 13 2. The students are offered all subjects required by law; and 14 <del>3.</del> The school is in compliance with all local and state health, fire, and safety laws-; 15 The school is in compliance with the academic content requirements provided in 3. sections 1 through 4 of this Act; and 16 17 The school is in compliance with section 15.1-06-04 regarding school calendar 4. 18 length. 19 **SECTION 6. REPEAL.** Sections 15-38-07, 15-38-08, 15-38-09, 15-38-10, 15-38-11, 20 and 15-38-12 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
