- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 12.1-23-05 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the penalty for theft of anhydrous ammonia; and to provide a penalty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 12.1-23-05 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

 Theft under this chapter is a class C felony if:

 The property or services stolen exceed five hundred dollars in value;

 The property or services stolen are acquired or retained by threat and (1) are acquired or retained by a public servant by a threat to take or withhold official
 - acquired or retained by a public servant by a threat to take or withhold official action, or (2) exceed fifty dollars in value;c. The property or services stolen exceed fifty dollars in value and are acquired
 - d. The property stolen is a firearm, ammunition, explosive or destructive device, or an automobile, aircraft, or other motor-propelled vehicle;

or retained by a public servant in the course of official duties;

- The property consists of any government file, record, document, or other government paper stolen from any government office or from any public servant;
- f. The defendant is in the business of buying or selling stolen property and the defendant receives, retains, or disposes of the property in the course of that business;
- g. The property stolen consists of any implement, paper, or other thing uniquely associated with the preparation of any money, stamp, bond, or other document, instrument, or obligation of this state;
