2	North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of city council members and commissioners.		
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:		
4	SEC	CTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 40-04.1-02 of the 1999 Supplement to the North	
5	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
6	40-04.1-02. Compensation of council members. The members of the council shall		
7	are entitled to receive such compensation for their services as is fixed by ordinance, but not		
8	more than the maximum provided for the members of the governing board under any other		
9	form of city government.		
10	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 40-08-07 of the 1999 Supplement to the North		
11	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
12	40-08-07. Compensation of council members. Each council member may is entitled		
13	to receive compensation for services as established by ordinance, but the compensation may		
14	not exceed the following limitations based upon the population of the city according to the latest		
15	state or federal census:		
16	<del>1.</del>	In cities not exceeding two thousand in population, sixty dollars per month.	
17	<del>2.</del>	In cities over two thousand and not exceeding six thousand in population, one	
18		hundred dollars per month.	
19	<del>3.</del>	In cities over six thousand and not exceeding thirty thousand in population, one	
20		hundred ninety-five dollars per month.	
21	<del>4.</del>	In cities having a population of over thirty thousand, four hundred forty-five dollars	
22		<del>per month</del> .	

Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

**SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 40-09-06 of the 1999 Supplement to the North

I	40-0	19-06. Style of board - Oath and salary of commissioners. The commissioners	
2	and the president of the board constitute the board of city commissioners and shall take an		
3	oath faithfully to perform the duties of their respective offices. The monthly salary of each city		
4	commissioner must be fixed by ordinance, but the compensation shall not exceed the following		
5	limitations based upon the population of the city according to the latest state or federal census:		
6	<del>1.</del>	In cities not exceeding one thousand in population, fifty dollars.	
7	<del>2.</del>	In cities over one thousand and not exceeding two thousand in population, sixty	
8		<del>dollars.</del>	
9	<del>3.</del>	In cities over two thousand and not exceeding four thousand in population, ninety	
10		<del>dollars.</del>	
11	<del>4.</del>	In cities over four thousand and not exceeding six thousand in population, one	
12		hundred twenty dollars.	
13	<del>5.</del>	In cities over six thousand and not exceeding eight thousand in population, two	
14		hundred five dollars.	
15	<del>6.</del>	In cities over eight thousand and not exceeding twelve thousand in population, two	
16		hundred seventy dollars.	
17	<del>7.</del>	In cities over twelve thousand and not exceeding thirty thousand in population,	
18		three hundred ninety dollars.	
19	<del>8.</del>	In cities over thirty thousand and not exceeding forty thousand in population, six	
20		hundred sixty dollars.	
21	<del>9.</del>	In cities having a population of over forty thousand, eight hundred ten dollars.	
22	The president of a commission may receive a salary of up to fifty percent more than the level		
23	set for each commissioner upon resolution by the board of city commissioners.
