A concurrent resolution urging the state's congressional delegation to support and work to
enact the tax relief proposal introduced by President Bush.
WHEREAS, President George W. Bush honored the state of North Dakota with his visit
to the state on Thursday, March 8, 2001; and
WHEREAS, federal taxes are the highest they have ever been during peacetime; and
WHEREAS, all taxpayers should be allowed to keep more of their own money; and
WHEREAS, the best way to encourage economic growth is to cut marginal tax rates
across all tax brackets; and
WHEREAS, President Bush, on his visit to North Dakota, pledged his commitment to
end the estate tax, commonly known as the death tax; and
WHEREAS, under current tax law, low-income workers often pay the highest marginal
rates; and
WHEREAS, President Bush's tax relief plan will contribute to raising the standard of
living for all Americans; and
WHEREAS, President Bush's tax relief plan will increase access to the middle class for
hard-working families, treat all middle-class families more fairly, encourage entrepreneurship
and growth, and promote charitable giving and education; and
WHEREAS, under President Bush's tax relief plan, the largest percentage reductions
will go to the lowest-income earners;
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the state's congressional delegation
