A charter or ordinance or act of a governing body of a home rule county may not supersede any state law ~~which that~~ determines what property or acts are subject to, or exempt from, ad valorem ~~or sales and use~~ taxes. A charter or ordinance or act of the governing body of a home rule county may not supersede ~~the provisions of~~ section 11-11-55.1 relating to the sixty percent petition requirement for improvements and of section 40-22-18 relating to the barring proceeding for improvement projects."
