SCR 4042: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of a centralized process for administering noncriminal traffic violations.

The department shall contract with a nonprofit private entity for the establishment and operation of a statewide, toll-free telephone referral service through which a person seeking services to assist a woman through pregnancy, childbirth, or adoption is referred to an appropriate service agency. The toll-free telephone referral service must refer to all appropriate agencies in a specific geographical area and may not refer a person to any agency that provides abortion counseling or referral services or advocates for, or performs abortions."
