2		district no longer exists, the application must be forwarded to the school district that
3		has jurisdiction. If a school district decides not to issue a diploma under this
4		program, the veteran may apply to the superintendent of public instruction for the
5		diploma.
6	<del>3.</del> <u>4.</u>	The school district and the superintendent of public instruction shall review and
7		either approve or deny each application received.
8	<u>4. 5.</u>	If a veteran who would have qualified for a diploma under this section is deceased,

9 a family member of the veteran may apply for and, if approved, be awarded the
10 veteran's honorary high school diploma.
