1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 43-12.1-10 and a new

2 section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to transitional nurse

3 licensure and continuing education; to amend and reenact section 43-12.1-02, subsection 2 of

4 section 43-12.1-04, and sections 43-12.1-08 and 43-12.1-09 of the North Dakota Century

5 Code, relating to nursing education programs; and to provide for application.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

9 43-12.1-02. Definitions. In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise
10 requires:

- "Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license
 to practice in this state as an advanced practice registered nurse and either has a
 graduate degree with a nursing focus or has completed the educational
 requirements in effect when the person was initially licensed.
- 15 2. "Board" means the North Dakota board of nursing.
- 3. "Licensed practical nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice
 in this state as a licensed practical nurse and either has an associate degree with
 a major in nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when
 the person was initially licensed.
- 4. "Nurse" means any person currently licensed as an advanced practice registered
 nurse, registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse.
- S. "Nursing" means the performance of acts utilizing specialized knowledge, skills,
 and abilities for people in a variety of settings. Nursing includes the following acts,

1		which may not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or treatment or the			
2		practice of medicine as defined in chapter 43-17:			
3		a. The maintenance of health and prevention of illness.			
4		b. Diagnosing human responses to actual or potential health problems.			
5		c. Providing supportive and restorative care and nursing treatment, medication			
6		administration, health counseling and teaching, case finding and referral of			
7		persons who are ill, injured, or experiencing changes in the normal health			
8		processes.			
9		d. Administration, teaching, supervision, delegation, and evaluation of health			
10		and nursing practices.			
11		e. Collaboration with other health care professionals in the implementation of the			
12		total health care regimen and execution of the health care regimen prescribed			
13		by a health care practitioner licensed under title 43.			
14	6.	"Prescriptive practices" means assessing the need for drugs, immunizing agents,			
15		or devices and writing a prescription to be filled by a licensed pharmacist.			
16	7.	"Registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice in this			
17		state as a registered nurse and either has a baccalaureate degree with a major in			
18		nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when the person			
19		was initially licensed.			
20	8.	"Specialty practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license			
21		to practice in this state as a specialty practice registered nurse and has the			
22		educational preparation and national certification within a defined area of nursing			
23		practice.			
24	9.	"Transitional practical nurse license" means a license issued by the board to a			
25		person who meets all of the requirements for licensure by endorsement as a			
26		licensed practical nurse, except the educational requirements.			
27	10.	"Transitional registered nurse license" means a license issued by the board to a			
28		person who meets all of the requirements for licensure by endorsement as a			
29		registered nurse, except the educational requirements.			

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- 11. "Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse who regardless of
 title is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions delegated and
 supervised by a licensed nurse.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 43-12.1-04 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- Students <u>A student</u> practicing nursing as a part of a board-approved nursing
 education program preparing for initial or advanced licensure as a registered nurse
 or licensed practical nurse which is located in an institution of higher education that
 offers transferable credit.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 43-12.1-08. Powers and duties of the board. The board shall regulate the practice of nursing to assure that qualified competent practitioners and high quality standards are available. Regulation of the profession of nursing must ensure that no person may practice or offer to practice nursing or use titles of advanced practice registered nurse, specialty practice registered nurse, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, or unlicensed assistive person, or titles of a similar nature which denote the practice of nursing to the general public unless licensed or registered as provided in this chapter. The board shall:
- Enforce the provisions of this chapter. The board has all of the duties, powers,
 and authority specifically granted by and necessary for the enforcement of this
 chapter.
- 22 2. Adopt rules necessary to administer this chapter.
- Appoint and employ a qualified registered nurse to serve as executive director and
 approve any additional staff positions necessary to administer this chapter.
- 4. Establish fees and receive all moneys collected under this chapter and authorize
 all expenditures necessary to conduct the business of the board. Any balance of
 fees after payment of expenditures must be used to administer this chapter.
- 28 5. Establish qualifications for nursing licensure and registration.
- 29 6. Establish standards for nursing education and practice and:
- a. Collaborate and consult with the appropriate nursing organizations and other
 affected parties in the establishment of the standards; and

1		b. Consult with the medical profession in the establishment of prescriptive
2		practice standards for advanced practice registered nurses. Prescriptive
3		practices must be consistent with the scope of practice of the advanced
4		practice registered nurse and include evidence of a collaborative agreement
5		with a licensed physician.
6	7.	Periodically review and approve Establish standards for nursing education
7		programs leading to licensure and collaborate with nursing education program
8		approval organizations and accreditation organizations. The board may not restrict
9		the offering in this state of nursing programs accredited by the national league for
10		nursing accrediting commission, or the commission on collegiate nursing
11		education.
12	8.	License and register applicants and renew and reinstate licenses and registrations.
13	9.	Establish standards for assessing the competence of licensees and registrants
14		continuing in or returning to practice Approve for licensure graduates of nursing
15		education programs that are recognized by the board or that are accredited by
16		national nursing program accreditation organizations that are recognized by the
17		board. However, a graduate of a nursing education program that is not located in
18		the United States, Canada, or the United States' possessions or territories must
19		have a baccalaureate degree in order to be licensed as a registered nurse. The
20		board may not restrict the offering in this state of nursing programs accredited by
21		the national league for nursing accrediting commission, incorporated, or the
22		commission on collegiate nursing education.
23	10.	Collect and analyze data regarding nursing education, nursing practice, and
24		nursing resources.
25	11.	Issue limited licenses to individuals requiring accommodation to practice nursing.
26	12.	Establish confidential programs for the rehabilitation of nurses with workplace
27		impairments.
28	13.	Discipline applicants, licensees, and registrants for violating this chapter.
29	14.	Establish a nursing student loan program funded by license fees to encourage
30		persons to enter and advance in the nursing profession.
31	15.	Establish a registry of persons licensed or registered by the board.

1	16.	Colla	aborate and consult with the North Dakota nurses association, North Dakota
2		licer	nsed practical nurses association, and other nursing specialty groups prior to
3		the a	adoption of rules.
4	17.	Rep	ort annually to the governor and nursing profession regarding the regulation of
5		nurs	sing in the state.
6	18.	Con	duct and support projects pertaining to nursing education and practice.
7	19.	Noti	fy the board of pharmacy on an annual basis, or more frequent basis if
8		nece	essary, of advanced practice registered nurses authorized to write
9		pres	scriptions.
10	20.	Ado	pt rules to allow nurses licensed by another state to receive short-term clinical
11		edu	cation in North Dakota health care facilities.
12	SEC		A 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
13	amended a	nd re	enacted as follows:
14	43-1	2.1-0	09. Licensure - Registration. Each applicant who successfully meets the
15	requiremen	ts of t	this section is entitled to initial licensure or registration as follows:
16	1.	An a	applicant for licensure by examination to practice as a registered nurse or
17		licer	nsed practical nurse shall:
18		a.	Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the
19			board;
20		b.	Submit an official transcript showing completion of a board-approved nursing
21			education program preparing for the level of licensure sought; and
22		C.	Pass an examination approved by the board.
23	2.	An a	applicant for licensure by endorsement to practice as a registered nurse or
24		licer	nsed practical nurse shall:
25		a.	Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the
26			board;
27		b.	Submit an official transcript showing completion of a nursing education
28			program equal to or exceeding the requirements for nursing education
29			programs in place in this state at the time the applicant qualified for initial
30			licensure preparing for the level of licensure sought;

1			c. Submit proof of initial licensure by examination with the examination meeting
2			the state requirements for licensure examinations in effect at the time the
3			applicant qualified for initial licensure; and
4			d. Submit evidence of current unencumbered licensure in another state or
5			territory or meet continued competency requirements as established by the
6			board.
7		3.	If an applicant for licensure by endorsement does not meet the educational
8			requirements for the appropriate level of licensure as established by the board, a
9			transitional license may be issued. A transitional license may be issued and
10			renewed according to board rules. Renewal requires proof of progression towards
11			meeting the academic requirements or thirty hours of continuing education.
12		4.	An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse shall:
13			a. Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the
14			board;
15			b. Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in an
16			advanced nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as
17			established by the board; and
18			c. Possess or show evidence of application for a current unencumbered
19			registered nurse license.
20	5.	<u>4.</u>	An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse who
21			completed an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified
22			in advanced practice by another state before January 1, 2001, or who completed
23			an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified as a
24			women's health care nurse practitioner by another state before January 1, 2007,
25			may apply for and receive an advanced practice license if that person meets the
26			requirements that were in place in this state at the time the applicant qualified for
27			initial advanced practice licensure in that state.
28	6.	<u>5.</u>	An applicant for unlicensed assistive person registration shall:
29			a. Submit a completed application and the appropriate fee as established by the
30			board; and

1		b. Provide verification of appropriate training, evidence of certification or			
2		evaluation in the performance of basic nursing interventions.			
3	3 7. <u>6.</u> An applicant for licensure as a specialty practice registered nurse shall:				
4		a. Submit a completed application and appropriate fees as established by the			
5		board;			
6		b. Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in a			
7		specialty nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as			
8		established by the board; and			
9		c. Possess or show evidence of application for a current unencumbered			
10		registered nurse license.			
11	SECTION 5. A new subsection to section 43-12.1-10 of the North Dakota Century				
12	Code is created and enacted as follows:				
13		An individual who holds a license as a transitional practical nurse or a transitional			
14		registered nurse on August 1, 2003, may renew that license for the 2004 licensure			
15		year. Effective with the 2005 licensure year, the board may not renew transitional			
16		licenses.			
17	SEC	CTION 6. A new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
18	created and	enacted as follows:			
19	Cor	ntinuing education requirements. The board shall adopt rules requiring every			
20	nurse licens	sed in the state to fulfill continuing education requirements. Before the board may			
21	renew a lice	ense, the licensee shall submit evidence to the board establishing that all continuing			
22	education re	equirements prescribed by the rules adopted by the board have been met. The			
23	continuing e	education requirements must be the same for all nurses, regardless of the type of			
24	nurse or the	e level of education.			
25	SEC	CTION 7. APPLICATION. The licensure requirements of section 6 of this Act are			

26 effective beginning with the 2005 licensure year.
