1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
2 Century Code, relating to instruction in abstinence in sex education.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 created and enacted as follows:

6 **Sex education - Instruction in abstinence.**

- 7 1. The superintendent of public instruction shall use abstinence education as the
8 state standard for any sex-related education taught in the public schools.
- 9 2. For purposes of this section, "abstinence education" includes any type of
10 instruction or program which, at an appropriate age:
- 11 a. Teaches the social, psychological, and health gains to be realized by
12 abstaining from sexual activity, and the negative psychological and physical
13 effects of not abstaining;
- 14 b. Teaches the consequences to the student, the student's parents, and society
15 that bearing children out of wedlock and abortion are likely to produce,
16 including the health, educational, financial, and other challenges the student
17 and the student's parents are likely to face;
- 18 c. Teaches that unwanted sexual advances are irresponsible and teaches how
19 to reject sexual advances and how alcohol and drug use increase vulnerability
20 to sexual advances;
- 21 d. Teaches that abstinence from sexual activity before marriage and fidelity
22 within marriage are the only certain ways to avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy,
23 sexually transmitted diseases, and related health problems, provided the
24 instruction or program may include a discussion on contraceptives only if such

- 1 discussion includes a factual presentation of the risks, failure rates, diseases
2 not protected against, and abortifacient characteristics of those
3 contraceptives, and further provided that in no case shall the instruction or
4 program include any demonstration of how condoms or other contraceptives
5 are applied;
- 6 e. Teaches the current state law related to sexual conduct, including forcible
7 rape, statutory rape, paternity establishment, and child support; and
- 8 f. Teaches the health and societal benefits of marriage, the meaning of
9 commitment, and the skills and attitudes needed to make marriage sacred.
- 10 3. Local school districts, in their discretion, may host programs designed to teach
11 parents how to discuss abstinence with their children.
