

HOUSE BILL NO. 1434

1 A BILL for an Act to regulate the sale and delivery of tobacco products by certain methods; and
2 to provide a penalty.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. Prohibited acts regarding sale of tobacco products to minors.** It is
5 unlawful for any person in the business of selling tobacco products to take an order for a
6 tobacco product, other than from a person who is in the business of selling tobacco products,
7 through the mail or through any telecommunications means, including by telephone, facsimile,
8 or the internet, if in providing for the sale or delivery of the product pursuant to the order, the
9 person mails the product or ships the product by carrier in or affecting interstate commerce, and
10 the person fails to comply with each of the following procedures:

11 1. Before mailing or shipping the product, the person receives from the individual who
12 places the order the following:

13 a. A copy of a valid government-issued document that provides the name,
14 address, and date of birth of the individual;

15 b. A signed statement in writing from the individual providing a certification that
16 the person:

17 (1) Is a smoker of legal minimum purchase age in the state;

18 (2) Wants to receive mailings from a tobacco company; and

19 (3) Understands that providing false information may constitute a violation
20 of law; and

21 2. Before mailing or shipping the product, the person:

22 a. Verifies the date of birth or age of the individual against a commercially
23 available data base; or

- 1 b. Obtains a photocopy or other image of the valid, government-issued
2 identification stating the date of birth or age of the person placing the order.
- 3 3. In the case of an order for a product pursuant to an advertisement on the internet,
4 the person receives payment by credit card or check for the order before mailing or
5 shipping the product.
- 6 4. a. The person employs a method of mailing or shipping the product requiring
7 that the individual purchasing the product:
- 8 (1) Be the addressee;
- 9 (2) Have an individual of legal minimum purchase age sign for delivery of
10 the package; and
- 11 (3) If the individual appears to the carrier making the delivery to be under
12 twenty-seven years of age, take delivery of the package only after
13 producing valid government-issued identification that bears a
14 photograph of the individual, indicates that the individual is not under
15 the legal age to purchase cigarettes, and indicates that the individual is
16 not younger than the age indicated on the government-issued
17 document.
- 18 b. The bill of lading clearly states the requirements in subdivision a and specifies
19 that state law requires compliance with the requirements.
- 20 5. The person notifies the carrier for the mailing or shipping, in writing, of the age of
21 the addressee as indicated by the government-issued document.

22 **SECTION 2. Rule of construction regarding common carriers.** This Act may not be
23 construed as imposing liability upon any common carrier, or officer or employee of the carrier
24 when acting within the scope of business of the common carrier.

25 **SECTION 3. E-mail addresses.** persons taking delivery sale orders may request that
26 prospective purchasers provide their e-mail addresses.

27 **SECTION 4. Registration and reporting requirements.**

- 28 1. Before making delivery sales or shipping cigarettes in connection with those sales,
29 every person shall file with the attorney general a statement setting forth the
30 person's name, trade name, and the address of the person's principal place of
31 business and any other place of business.

1 2. Not later than the tenth day of each month, each person that has made a delivery
2 sale or shipped or delivered cigarettes in connection with any sale during the
3 previous calendar month shall file with the tax commissioner a memorandum or a
4 copy of the invoice, which provides for each delivery sale:

- 5 a. The name and address of the individual to whom the delivery sale was made;
6 b. The brand or brands of the cigarettes that were sold in the delivery sale; and
7 c. The quantity of cigarettes that were sold in the delivery sale.

8 **SECTION 5. Taxes.** Each person making a delivery sale shall collect and remit to the
9 tax commissioner any taxes levied by the state with respect to the delivery sale pursuant to
10 chapter 57-36, except that the collection and remission may not be required to the extent the
11 person has obtained proof, in the form of the presence of applicable tax stamps or otherwise,
12 that the taxes already have been paid to the state.

13 **SECTION 6. Penalties.**

- 14 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person that violates this Act is
15 subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars. In the case of a second or
16 subsequent violation of this Act, the person is subject to a fine of not less than one
17 thousand dollars nor more than five thousand dollars.
- 18 2. Any person who knowingly violates any provision of this Act, or who knowingly and
19 falsely submits a certification under subdivision a of subsection 4 of section 1 of
20 this Act in another person's name, is guilty of a class C felony.
- 21 3. Any person that fails to pay any tax required in connection with a delivery sale shall
22 pay, in addition to any other penalty, a penalty of fifty percent of the tax due but
23 unpaid.
- 24 4. Any cigarettes sold or attempted to be sold in a delivery sale that does not meet
25 the requirements of this Act are forfeited to the state and must be destroyed.

26 **SECTION 7.** The attorney general or any person who holds a permit under 26 U.S.C.
27 5712 may bring an action in the appropriate court in the state to prevent or restrain violations of
28 this Act by any person or any person controlling that person.
