- SB 2168: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 60-01-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the assumption of lost property or money by a finder. Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

- SB 2169: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-09-36 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to student fees for the use of musical instruments.

**SB 2170:** A BILL for an Act to prohibit resisting service of process; and to provide a penalty. Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

**SB 2171:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to lodging reimbursement for state officers and employees.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Trenbeath, Lyson, Thane and Reps. Klemin, Maragos, Tieman introduced:

**SB 2172:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 57-38-30.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an income tax deduction under the simplified method of computing tax for military retirement pay and military active duty or national guard pay; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
