- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 53 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to the licensing and regulating of live poker; and to amend and reenact
- 3 subsection 1 of section 12.1-28-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition
- 4 of gambling.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 12.1-28-01 of the North Dakota
7	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

8	1.	"Gambling" means risking any money, credit, deposit, or other thing of value for
9		gain, contingent, wholly or partially, upon lot, chance, the operation of gambling
10		apparatus, or the happening or outcome of an event, including an election or
11		sporting event, over which the person taking the risk has no control. Gambling
12		does not include:

- a. Lawful contests of skill, <u>including internet live poker</u>, or <u>lawful contests of</u>
 speed, strength, or endurance in which awards are made only to entrants or
 to the owners of entries; or
- b. Lawful business transactions, or other acts or transactions now or hereafter
 expressly authorized by law.
- 18 SECTION 2. A new chapter to title 53 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and19 enacted as follows:
- Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
 1. "Adjusted gross proceeds" means any sums wagered in an internet live poker hand
 which may be retained by the licensed internet live poker establishment as
 compensation.

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1	<u>2.</u>	<u>"Inte</u>	rnet live poker" means a card game played by players who are dealt cards by			
2		<u>an o</u>	nline nonplayer dealer with the objective of each player betting the superiority			
3		of th	e player's own hand and winning the other players' bets by either making a bet			
4		<u>no o</u>	ther player is willing to match or proving to hold the most valuable cards after			
5		<u>the b</u>	petting is over. The internet live poker games include Texas hold'em, Omaha			
6		<u>high</u> /	low, Omaha high, draw, stud, low ball, any combination of these games, or			
7		any o	other similar poker game.			
8	<u>3.</u>	<u>"Lice</u>	ensed internet live poker establishment" means any premises licensed by the			
9		attor	ney general pursuant to this chapter to conduct games of internet live poker.			
10	0 Internet live poker authorized. Internet live poker games are authorized and may be					
11	operated by a licensed internet live poker establishment in accordance with this chapter. The					
12	attorney general shall license and regulate the playing of internet live poker at licensed internet					
13	live poker establishments in the state. The attorney general shall adopt rules for the licensure,					
14	regulation, and operation of internet live poker in the state.					
15	Inte	ternet live poker sites - Tax.				
16	<u>1.</u>	The	attorney general may contract with a private entity for the development and			
17		imple	ementation of a program for the licensing and regulation of internet live poker			
18		<u>sites</u>	in the state. The program must include a license fee for each person that			
19		<u>oper</u>	ates an internet live poker site and an annual licensing fee of ten dollars for			
20		<u>each</u>	n player who plays internet live poker at a site. A single annual licensing fee			
21		<u>entit</u>	les a player to play internet live poker at any site licensed under this chapter.			
22	<u>2.</u>	The	following tax is imposed on the adjusted gross proceeds of internet live poker			
23		gam	es for each establishment authorized under this chapter:			
24		<u>a.</u>	Eight percent on the first one million dollars;			
25		<u>b.</u>	Six percent on the second one million dollars;			
26		<u>C.</u>	Four percent on the third one million dollars;			
27		<u>d.</u>	Two percent on the next five million dollars;			
28		<u>e.</u>	One-half of one percent on the next fifty million dollars; and			
29		<u>f.</u>	One-fourth of one percent on any amount in excess of fifty-eight million			
30			dollars.			

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1	<u>3.</u>	The licensed internet live poker establishment shall remit the tax to the attorney
2		general on a quarterly basis. The attorney general shall remit the tax, licensing
3		fees, and any other moneys collected under this chapter to the state treasurer for
4		deposit in the internet live poker proceeds fund.

Internet live poker proceeds fund. There is created in the state treasury an internet
live poker proceeds fund. The fund consists of the internet live poker tax, licensing fees, and
any other moneys collected under this chapter. Annually, all moneys in the fund must be

8 <u>allocated for:</u>

9	<u>1.</u>	Annual transfer to the counties for direct property tax relief. The amount allocated
10		to a county must be subtracted from the county's base year levy under section
11		57-15-01.1 for the purpose of determining the county's maximum levy under
12		section 57-15-01.1 and subtracted from the maximum levy in dollars that would be
13		produced by the maximum levy in mills under section 57-15-06. Transfers under
14		this subsection must equal sixty percent of total annual transfers from the internet
15		live poker proceeds fund.
16	<u>2.</u>	Annual transfers to the common schools trust fund to become a part of the
17		principal of that fund. Transfers under this subsection must equal twenty percent
18		of total annual transfers from the internet live poker proceeds fund.
19	<u>3.</u>	Annual transfers to the general fund. Transfers under this subsection must equal
20		twenty percent of the total annual transfers from the internet live poker proceeds
21		fund.
