1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to vacancies in office of a member of the legislative assembly; and to

3 amend and reenact section 16.1-13-10 and subsection 3 of section 44-02-02 of the North

4 Dakota Century Code, relating to filling a vacancy in a legislative office and resignation of a

5 member of the legislative assembly.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

9 16.1-13-10. Vacancy existing in office of member of legislative assembly. 10 1. If a vacancy in the office of a member of the legislative assembly occurs, the 11 county auditor of the county in which the former member resides or resided shall 12 notify the chairman of the legislative council governor of the vacancy. The county 13 auditor need not notify the chairman of the legislative council governor of the 14 resignation of a member of the legislative assembly when the resignation was 15 made under section 44-02-02. Upon receiving notification of a vacancy, the 16 chairman of the legislative council governor, if there is a regular session of the 17 legislative assembly between the time the vacancy occurs and the next general 18 election, shall issue a writ of election directed to the county auditor of each affected 19 county commanding the county auditor to hold a special election to fill the vacancy 20 at a time designated by the governor. If there is no regular session of the 21 legislative assembly between the time the vacancy occurs and the next general 22 election, and the term of the office for that office does not end before the next 23 regular session of the legislative assembly, the governor shall direct that a special 24 election be held at the same time as the general election. If there is no regular

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1		session of the legislative assembly between the time the vacancy occurs and the
2		expiration of the term of office of the member whose office is vacated, the governor
3		may issue a writ of election to hold a special election to fill the vacancy. An
4		individual elected to fill a vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of office
5		for that office.
6	<u>2.</u>	If a vacancy occurs in the office of a member of the legislative assembly while the
7		legislative assembly is in regular session, the governor shall notify the district
8		committee of the political party that the former member represented in the district in
9		which the vacancy exists. The district committee shall hold a meeting within
10		twenty-one days after receiving the notification and select an individual nominate
11		three individuals to fill the vacancy. The district committee shall submit its
12		nominations to the governor who shall appoint one of the nominees within seven
13		days after receiving the nominations. If the former member was elected as an
14		independent candidate or if the district committee does not make an appointment
15		submit nominations within twenty-one days after receiving the notice from the
16		chairman of the legislative council of the vacancy, the chairman of the legislative
17		council governor shall appoint a resident of the district to fill the vacancy. Except
18		as provided in subsection 2, if eight hundred twenty-eight days or more remain until
19		the expiration of the term of office for that office, the The individual appointed to fill
20		the vacancy shall serve until a successor is elected at and qualified following the
21		next general election or special election called by the governor according to
22		subsection 2 to serve for the remainder of the term of office for that office.
23	2.	The qualified electors of a legislative district in which a vacancy in the legislative
24		assembly occurs may petition for a special election to be called by the governor to
25		fill the vacancy. The petition must include the signatures of qualified electors equal
26		in number to four percent of the resident population of the legislative district as
27		determined by the last federal decennial census and must be presented to the
28		secretary of state within thirty days following an appointment being made according
29		to subsection 1. If the secretary of state determines the petition contains the
30		required number of signatures of qualified electors of the affected legislative
31		district, the secretary of state shall notify the governor that a special election is

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1		required to be called to fill the vacancy. Upon receiving such notice, the governor	
2		shall issue a writ of election directed to the county auditor of each affected county	
3		commanding the county auditor to hold a special election to fill the vacancy at a	
4		time designated by the governor. A special election under this section must	
5		conform to the applicable election deadlines found in this title and may be called to	
6		coincide with a regularly scheduled primary or general election provided the special	
7		election is called by the fifteenth day before the deadline for candidates to file for	
8		office before a regularly scheduled primary or general election. A special election	
9		under this section may not be scheduled to occur during the time from a general	
10		election through eighty days following the adjournment of the next ensuing regular	
11		session of the legislative assembly.	
12	3.	The secretary of state must be notified of an appointment made by a district	
13		committee or the chairman of the legislative council the governor according to this	
14		section. Upon notification, the secretary of state shall issue the appointee a	
15		certificate of appointment and an oath of office for the appointee to complete and	
16		file with the secretary of state.	
17	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 44-02-02 of the North Dakota	
18	18 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
19	3.	A member of the legislative assembly, to the presiding officer of the branch of	
20		which the individual is a member, when in session, and when not in session, to the	
21		chairman of the legislative council governor. When made to the presiding officer,	
22		the presiding officer at once shall notify the chairman of the legislative council	
23		governor of the resignation.	
24	SEC	TION 3. A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
25	created and	l enacted as follows:	
26	Mer	nber of legislative assembly - Change of residence outside legislative district	
27	creates vac	cancy. If a member of the legislative assembly establishes a residence outside the	
28	district from	which the member was elected, the individual is deemed to have vacated the	
29	office.
