4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:

- Instruction of students Pronunciation of English Requirements.
- Before an individual may be employed or assigned to instruct students in an
 undergraduate class at an institution under the control of the state board of higher
 education, the chairman of the department in which the individual would be
 employed or to which the individual would be assigned shall conduct an oral
 interview with the individual and document that the individual speaks English
 clearly and with good pronunciation.

 2. If a student who is enrolled in a class for which an individual is providing instruction
 15 notifies in writing the chairman of the department and the dean of the college that
 16 the student believes the individual employed or assigned to instruct that class does
 17 not speak English clearly and with good pronunciation, the institution of higher
 18 education shall, upon request of the student, reimburse the student for all tuition
 19 and fees paid for that class by or on behalf of the student and the student may
 20 withdraw from the class with no financial or academic penalties.
- When the dean of any college under any institution under the control of the state
 board of higher education receives written notification from students equal in
 number to ten percent of those enrolled in a class on the tenth academic day that
 an individual employed or assigned to instruct the class does not speak English

1	clearly and with good pronunciation, the dean shall direct the chairman of the
2	relevant department to reassign the individual to a nonteaching position. The
3	individual may not be permitted to instruct students until such time as a majority of
4	a three-member panel determines that the individual can speak English clearly and
5	with good pronunciation. The three-member panel must consist of:
6	a. One vice president selected by the president of the institution;
7	b. One member of the institution's student governing body selected by the
8	president of the student governing body; and
9	c. One individual agreed to by both of the other members of the panel.
