1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact seventeen new sections to chapter 63-01.1 of the North
2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the control of eradication of noxious weeds and pests; to
3 amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 4-33-11, and sections 63-01.1-01, 63-01.1-02,
4 63-01.1-03, 63-01.1-03.1, 63-01.1-04, 61-01.1-04.1, 61-03.1-05, 63-01.1-05.1, 63-01.1-06,
5 63-01.1-08, 63-01.1-09, 63-01.1-10.1, 63-01.1-12, 63-01.1-12.1, 63-01.1-12.2, 63-01.1-13,
6 63-01.1-14, and 63-01.1-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the control and
7 eradication of noxious weeds and pests; and to repeal section 63-01.1-04.2 of the North Dakota
8 Century Code, relating to pest control by county weed boards.

9 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

10 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 4-33-11 of the North Dakota
11 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 12 1. The governing body of any political subdivision may appropriate money for the
13 control of pests under this chapter or ~~section 63-01.1-04.2~~ chapter 63-01.1. If
14 state funds are involved, the money must be expended according to control plans
15 approved by the commissioner. The governing body of a political subdivision shall
16 determine the portion, if any, of control program costs that should be paid by the
17 political subdivision. Costs of the control program may be paid by moneys in the
18 emergency fund. If the emergency fund is not sufficient to carry out the program,
19 the governing body may expend money from the general fund and in this event the
20 governing body, except the governing body of a park district, upon approval of sixty
21 percent of those voting in any special election or the next regularly scheduled
22 primary or general election, may levy a tax during the following year upon all
23 taxable property in the political subdivision to fully reimburse the general fund for

1 the amount expended except that the levy may not exceed the limitation in
2 subsection 1 of section 57-15-28.1.

3 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **63-01.1-01. Control and eradication of noxious weeds.** ~~It shall be the duty of every~~
6 Every person in charge of or in possession of land in this state, whether as landowner, lessee,
7 renter, or tenant, under statutory authority or otherwise, ~~to~~ shall control or eradicate or to
8 ~~control the spread of~~ noxious weeds on those lands.

9 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 **63-01.1-02. Definitions.** As used in this chapter:

12 1. "Board member area" means a geographical area within the county from which a
13 member of the weed board is appointed.

14 2. "City weed control officer" means an individual designated by a city weed board to
15 be responsible for the operation and enforcement of this chapter within the city.

16 3. "Commissioner" means the agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's
17 designee.

18 ~~3.~~ 4. "Control" means to prevent the spread of any noxious weed, ~~designated by the~~
19 ~~commissioner or other control authority,~~ by seed or any other propagating part or, ~~if~~
20 ~~authorized,~~ to suppress, eradicate, ~~or prevent,~~ or retard the spread of a pest.

21 ~~4.~~ 5. "Control authority" means the commissioner, ~~the~~ a county weed board, and,
22 ~~pursuant to the county weed board's authorization, the~~ a county weed control
23 officer, a city weed board, or a city weed control officer.

24 ~~5.~~ "County weed board" means members of the board of each county as appointed
25 ~~pursuant to section 63-01.1-04.~~

26 6. "County weed control officer" means ~~the person~~ an individual designated by the
27 county weed board to be responsible for the operation and enforcement of this
28 chapter within each county.

29 7. "Eradicate" ~~or "eradication"~~ means to destroy a plant or, ~~if authorized,~~ a pest so
30 that it is not viable.

- 1 8. "Highway, street, or road" means a public way for purposes of vehicular travel,
2 including the entire area within the right of way. A highway in a rural area may be
3 called a "road" and a highway in an urban area may be called a "street".
- 4 9. "Landowner" means any owner of federal, state, municipal, or private land, under
5 statutory authority or otherwise. The term does not include a lessee, renter,
6 tenant, operator, or an owner of any easement or right of way.
- 7 9- 10. "noxious weed" means ~~any~~ a plant propagated by either seed or vegetative parts
8 and which is determined by the commissioner after consulting with the North
9 Dakota state university extension service; or which is determined by a county
10 weed board after consulting with the county extension agent; to be injurious to
11 public health, crops, livestock, land, or other property.
- 12 ~~10-~~ 11. "Operator" means the person ~~chiefly~~ responsible for the farming operations or
13 other operations being performed on the land, whether for self-benefit, or for the
14 benefit of the landowner or another.
- 15 ~~11-~~ "Person" ~~means any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, limited liability~~
16 ~~company, company, society, association, the state, or any department, agency, or~~
17 ~~subdivision thereof, or any other entity which occupies or owns land or which~~
18 ~~causes noxious weed seeds or propagating parts to be disseminated or~~
19 ~~transported in this state.~~
- 20 12. "Pest" means any pest defined in section 4-33-01 and ~~includes~~ a prairie dog.
- 21 13. "Township road" means a an improved public road that is an improved road, not
22 located in an incorporated city and not designated as part of a county, state, or
23 federal-aid road system, but constructed, maintained, graded, and drained by the
24 township, or county in the case of an unorganized township. A township road
25 includes a street in an unincorporated townsite ~~and~~; does not ~~necessarily~~ have to
26 be surfaced. ~~A; does not include a sodded road is not a township road. In order~~
27 ~~for; and includes~~ a section line ~~to be a township road it must be~~ if that section line
28 is graded and, drained, and be an improved a maintained road. A township road
29 ~~is a public road that is not designated as part of a county, state, or federal aid road~~
30 ~~system and is not located in an incorporated city.~~

1 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **63-01.1-03. State weed control authority - Agriculture commissioner - ~~Powers and~~**
4 **~~duties~~ Duties.** The commissioner shall:

- 5 1. ~~The duty of enforcing~~ Enforce this chapter ~~and carrying out its provisions and~~
6 intent is vested in the commissioner. ~~The commissioner shall cooperate;~~
- 7 2. Cooperate with other weed control authorities:-
- 8 ~~2.~~ The commissioner shall determine and law enforcement officers;
- 9 3. Determine which weeds are noxious ~~for the purposes of a state list of noxious~~
10 weeds after consulting with the North Dakota state university extension service ~~and~~
11 ~~shall compile;~~
- 12 4. Compile and keep ~~current~~ a list of noxious weeds:-
- 13 ~~3.~~ The commissioner shall outline;
- 14 5. Establish procedures; and prepare and supply ~~official~~ all notices, posters, ~~report~~
15 forms, and other documents needed in carrying out this chapter. ~~The~~
16 ~~commissioner shall supply these documents to weed control officers, county,~~
17 ~~township, and city authorities, and others as needed to carry out an effective weed~~
18 ~~control program or, if authorized, pest control program. The commissioner shall~~
19 ~~prepare notices of;~~
- 20 6. Prepare all notices and posters including featuring the noxious weed list, rules,
21 dates for controlling noxious weeds, and other compliance requirements, for
22 printing in official newspapers or for posting at least annually:-
- 23 ~~4.~~ The commissioner shall cooperate with the county weed board, county weed
24 ~~control officers, highway patrol officers, county sheriffs, and others in enforcing this~~
25 ~~chapter. The commissioner shall also encourage;~~
- 26 7. Encourage the North Dakota state university extension service to disseminate
27 information and to conduct educational campaigns with respect to the control and
28 ~~eradication and control~~ of noxious weeds ~~or, if authorized, and~~ pests:-
- 29 ~~5.~~ The commissioner upon receiving a written complaint shall immediately refer the
30 ~~complaint;~~

- 1 8. Forward all written complaints to the proper weed control officer or control
2 authority.
- 3 6. ~~The commissioner shall encourage the cooperation of agencies of both the federal~~
4 ~~and state governments in furtherance of the purposes of this chapter.~~
- 5 7. ~~The commissioner may adopt rules to carry out the intent of this chapter.~~
- 6 8. ~~The commissioner may require operational or program reports from weed control~~
7 ~~authorities or weed control officers regarding weed control progress and activity in~~
8 ~~the state and, if authorized, pest control progress and activity in the state.;~~
- 9 9. ~~The commissioner shall call~~ Call an annual meeting of all weed control officers,
10 either statewide or by areas, to review the intent, operation, procedures, and
11 accomplishments under this chapter and ~~may also request the North Dakota state~~
12 ~~university extension service or others to present educational information on weed~~
13 ~~control practices or, if authorized, pest control practices. Weed control authority~~
14 ~~members must be invited to attend meetings called pursuant to this subsection~~
15 ~~invite all weed control authority members to attend; and~~
- 16 10. Encourage the cooperation of federal and state agencies in furthering this chapter.

17 **SECTION 5.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18 created and enacted as follows:

19 **State weed control authority - Agriculture commissioner - Powers.** The
20 commissioner may require operational reports and program reports from weed control
21 authorities regarding both noxious weed control and pest control.

22 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
23 is amended and reenacted as follows:

24 **63-01.1-03.1. County weed board - Jurisdiction.** ~~All land within the boundaries of~~
25 ~~North Dakota, including all federal, state, private, and municipally owned lands, is included in~~
26 ~~the county weed board's jurisdiction within the county in which the land is located. The~~
27 ~~jurisdiction of each county weed board extends to all land within the county but does not include~~
28 ~~any land within the corporate limits of a city if that city has its own noxious weed control~~
29 ~~program under this chapter.~~

30 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **63-01.1-04. County weed board as ~~control authority~~ - Members - Terms -**
2 **Compensation.**

- 3 1. ~~The county weed board of each county is the control authority for that county.~~
- 4 2. ~~The~~ Each board of county commissioners shall establish ~~the number of members~~
5 ~~of the board and shall establish~~ county weed board member areas. Each county
6 weed board member area must be contiguous.
- 7 2. The board of county commissioners shall appoint a county weed board consisting
8 of no fewer than five ~~or~~ nor more than seven members. Members shall serve for a
9 term of four years or until their successors are appointed and qualified. The terms
10 ~~of members~~ must be staggered so that ~~the terms of~~ no more than two ~~members~~
11 expire each year. Any qualified elector residing in the board member area ~~subject~~
12 ~~to taxation~~ is eligible to represent that area on the board. In each county
13 encompassing a city with a population of five thousand or more, one board
14 member must be appointed from within the city corporate limits of that city unless
15 the city has established ~~a city~~ its own noxious weed control program pursuant to
16 ~~section 63-01.1-10.1~~ under this chapter.
- 17 3. A board member shall assume office at the first regular meeting of the county weed
18 board following that member's appointment.
- 19 4. The board of county commissioners shall remove a member of the county weed
20 board for repeated unexcused ~~failure~~ failures to attend meetings ~~or,~~ for refusal ~~or~~
21 ~~incapacity~~ to act as a board member. ~~When,~~ or for incapacity. If a vacancy occurs
22 on a county weed board, the board of county commissioners, at its next regular
23 meeting, shall appoint an individual, who possesses the necessary qualifications,
24 ~~as a board member~~ to fill the unexpired term.
- 25 5. The county weed board shall elect from its members a chairman and a vice
26 chairman, and shall appoint a secretary and a treasurer. The secretary and
27 treasurer need not be members of the county weed board.
- 28 6. The board of county commissioners may set rates of compensation for board
29 members. Board members are entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary
30 expenses and a mileage allowance at the rate established for state employees.

1 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
2 is amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **~~63-01.1-04.1. Powers and duties of county~~ County weed board - Duties.**

- 4 1. ~~The~~ Each county weed board shall designate a county weed control officer who
5 shall cooperate with the board and be responsible for the operation and
6 enforcement of this chapter within the ~~district~~ county. The county weed control
7 officer may be a member of the county weed board ~~or may be any other interested~~
8 ~~and able person. The same person.~~ An individual may serve as a county weed
9 ~~control officer for more than one county weed board.~~ Employment is for a tenure
10 and at rates of compensation and reimbursement for travel expenses as the county
11 weed board may prescribe and is without regard to any provisions of law relating to
12 age or dual compensation. ~~The~~ A county weed board shall certify the designation
13 of a county weed control officer to the commissioner.
- 14 2. ~~The county weed board may expend funds from those sources authorized in~~
15 ~~section 63-01.1-06 for the purpose of controlling noxious weeds, in addition to any~~
16 ~~other expenditures for control authorized by this chapter, when weeds have grown~~
17 ~~on any public or private land and a control authority finds that the extent of the~~
18 ~~weeds is so severe that their eradication would constitute an extreme financial~~
19 ~~burden upon the person otherwise liable for the expense.~~
- 20 3. ~~The county weed board may develop and compile a county list of noxious weeds.~~
21 ~~Any county list shall, at a minimum, contain those noxious weeds determined by~~
22 ~~the commissioner. The commissioner may remove a county weed board noxious~~
23 ~~weed determination from the county list after consulting with the board and the~~
24 ~~North Dakota state university extension service.~~
- 25 4. ~~County weed boards~~ Each county weed board shall cooperate with all other control
26 authorities.
- 27 5. ~~The~~
- 28 3. Each county weed board shall implement and pursue ~~an effective~~ a program for
29 the control of noxious weeds ~~and, if authorized, pests.~~

7 determine the progress of noxious weed control activities within the county ~~and, if~~

11 county, for noxious weed control, from any source.

13 7. Each county weed board shall ~~render~~ provide technical assistance to any city ~~with~~
14 that has a population of three thousand or more and which establishes a its own
15 noxious weed control program ~~as provided in section 63-01.1-10.1~~ under this
16 chapter.

17 ~~10. The county weed board may authorize the county weed control officer in~~
18 ~~cooperation with local law enforcement personnel to stop and inspect vehicles~~
19 ~~suspected of transporting noxious weed infested materials.~~

20 **SECTION 9.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
21 created and enacted as follows:

22 **County weed board - Powers.** A county weed board may:

23 1. Authorize the county weed control officer to cooperate with local law enforcement
24 personnel in stopping and inspecting vehicles suspected of transporting noxious
25 weed-infested materials.

26 2. Expend funds from all available sources if a control authority determines that the
27 extent of noxious weed infestation on certain land is so severe that eradication
28 would place an extreme financial burden on the person otherwise liable for the
29 expense.

30 **SECTION 10.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31 created and enacted as follows:

1 **County weed board - Development of county weed list.** A county weed board may
2 develop and compile its own list of noxious weeds, provided the list includes all weeds
3 determined to be noxious by the commissioner. The commissioner, after consulting with the
4 county weed board and the North Dakota state university extension service, may require that a
5 county weed board remove a noxious weed from its list.

6 **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **63-01.1-05. Duties of county weed control officer.** The county weed control officer
9 shall:

- 10 1. Cooperate with ~~the county weed board, other~~ all weed control authorities and ~~weed~~
11 ~~control officers, the~~ county extension agent, ~~county~~ agents, land users, the
12 ~~commissioner, and others in furtherance of the provisions of~~ to further this chapter.
- 13 2. Become acquainted with the location of noxious weeds and, if authorized, pests on
14 all land within the county.
- 15 3. ~~Through personal contact, by letter, telephone, or other means, encourage~~
16 Encourage noxious weed and, if authorized, pest control or eradication by all
17 landowners ~~or~~ and land occupants within the county.
- 18 4. Investigate all complaints regarding noxious weeds received by ~~the county weed~~
19 ~~control officer, the county weed board, or the commissioner~~ any control authority.
- 20 5. Take ~~proper~~ enforcement action when necessary.
- 21 6. ~~Cause to be posted or inserted~~ Post or publish in official newspapers ~~those official~~
22 any notices the commissioner may deem determines necessary ~~in the furtherance~~
23 ~~of~~ to further noxious weed control or eradication under this chapter.
- 24 7. Prepare reports as requested by the commissioner.
- 25 8. Attend area or statewide meetings called by the commissioner ~~for the purpose of~~
26 ~~assisting in the effective execution of~~ to further noxious weed control or eradication
27 under this chapter.
- 28 9. ~~Serve as county seed inspector for the purposes of enforcing the laws and~~
29 ~~regulations under the jurisdiction of the state seed department as directed by the~~
30 ~~state seed commissioner.~~

1 **SECTION 12.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2 created and enacted as follows:

3 **City weed board members - Terms - Compensation.**

- 4 1. If a city council elects to establish a noxious weed control program for the city, the
5 council shall appoint a city weed board consisting of no fewer than five nor more
6 than seven members. Members shall serve for a term of four years or until their
7 successors are appointed and qualified. The terms must be staggered so that no
8 more than two expire each year. Any qualified elector residing within the city is
9 eligible to serve on the board.
- 10 2. A board member shall assume office at the first regular meeting of the city weed
11 board following that member's appointment.
- 12 3. The city council shall remove a member of the city weed board for repeated
13 unexcused failures to attend meetings, for refusal to act as a board member, or for
14 incapacity. If a vacancy occurs on a city weed board, the city council, at its next
15 regular meeting, shall appoint an individual who possesses the necessary
16 qualifications to fill the unexpired term.
- 17 4. The city weed board shall elect from its members a chairman and a vice chairman
18 and shall appoint a secretary and a treasurer. The secretary and treasurer need
19 not be members of the city weed board.
- 20 5. The city council may set rates of compensation for city weed board members. City
21 weed board members are entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary
22 expenses and a mileage allowance at the rate established for city employees.

23 **SECTION 13.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24 created and enacted as follows:

25 **City weed board - Duties.**

- 26 1. Each city weed board shall designate a city weed control officer who shall
27 cooperate with the board and be responsible for the operation and enforcement of
28 this chapter within the city. The city weed control officer may be a member of the
29 city weed board. An individual may serve as a city weed control officer for more
30 than one city. Employment is for a tenure and at rates of compensation and
31 reimbursement for travel expenses as the city weed board may prescribe and is

- 1 without regard to any provision of law relating to dual compensation. A city weed
2 board shall certify the designation of a city weed control officer to the
3 commissioner.
- 4 2. Each city weed board shall cooperate with all other control authorities.
- 5 3. Each city weed board shall implement and pursue an effective program for the
6 control of noxious weeds.
- 7 4. Each city weed board shall fix the time and place of regular meetings. Each board
8 shall meet at least once each year. All meetings are open to the public. Each
9 board shall keep minutes of its meetings and a complete record of all official acts.
- 10 5. Each city weed board shall conduct at least one annual inspection to determine the
11 progress of weed control activities within the city.
- 12 6. Each city weed board shall control and disburse all moneys received by the city
13 from any source for noxious weed control.

14 **SECTION 14.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
15 created and enacted as follows:

16 **City weed board - Powers.** A city weed board may:

- 17 1. Authorize the city weed control officer to cooperate with local law enforcement
18 personnel in stopping and inspecting vehicles suspected of transporting noxious
19 weed-infested materials.
- 20 2. Expend funds from all available sources if a control authority determines that the
21 extent of noxious weed infestation on certain land is so severe that eradication
22 would place an extreme financial burden on the person otherwise liable for the

2 created and enacted as follows:

3 **Duties of city weed control officer.** The city weed control officer shall:

- 4 1. Cooperate with all weed control authorities, county extension agents, land users,
5 and others to further this chapter.
- 6 2. Become acquainted with the location of noxious weeds on all land within the city.
- 7 3. Encourage noxious weed control or eradication by all landowners and land
8 occupants within the city.
- 9 4. Investigate all complaints received by any control authority regarding noxious
10 weeds within the city.
- 11 5. Take enforcement action when necessary.
- 12 6. Post or publish in the official newspaper of the city any notices the commissioner
13 deems necessary to further noxious weed control or eradication under this chapter.
- 14 7. Prepare reports as requested by the commissioner.
- 15 8. Attend area or statewide meetings called by the commissioner to further noxious
16 weed control or eradication under this chapter.

17 **SECTION 17. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
18 is amended and reenacted as follows:

19 **63-01.1-05.1. Certification of county and city weed control officers - Extension**
20 **service.**

- 21 1. The commissioner ~~shall adopt rules setting the requirements for certification~~
22 ~~categories of county weed control officers~~, after consultation with the director of the
23 agricultural experiment station and the director of the North Dakota state university
24 extension service, or their ~~respective~~ designees, shall adopt rules governing
25 certification categories for county and city weed control officers. ~~All designated~~
26 Before assuming any duties, each county and city weed control ~~officers~~ officer
27 must be certified pursuant to the under rules adopted by the commissioner ~~before~~
28 assuming their duties.
- 29 2. The North Dakota state university extension service shall establish a program to
30 provide educational instruction to ~~local~~ county and city weed control officers.

1 **SECTION 18. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **63-01.1-06. Funding of county programs.**

- 4 1. a. The board of county commissioners may pay expenses from the county
5 general fund ~~in any one year in furtherance of~~ to further the county noxious
6 weed control program under this chapter, including to provide noxious weed
7 control or eradication along public highways in the county.
- 8 b. The county weed board may certify annually to the board of county
9 commissioners a tax, not to exceed two mills on the taxable valuation of all
10 taxable property in the county, to carry out this chapter. ~~In addition, the~~
11 ~~county weed board, with the approval of a majority vote of the~~
- 12 c. ~~The board of county commissioners; by majority vote~~ may certify up to two
13 additional mills on the taxable valuation of all taxable property in the county:
14 ~~If a county assesses more than three mills, at least one mill must be~~
15 ~~dedicated to leafy spurge control. However, the tax may not be levied on,~~
16 except property within the corporate limits of a city that establishes a program
17 under ~~section 63-01.1-10.4~~ this chapter.
- 18 d. The board of county commissioners shall levy the tax.
- 19 e. The county treasurer shall hold all taxes levied and collected in a separate
20 ~~funds to be fund~~ known as the noxious weed control or eradication fund ~~and~~
21 ~~the leafy spurge fund, which shall be used to carry out this chapter. The levy~~
22 ~~shall be made to cover the salary.~~ Moneys in the fund must be used to pay
23 the salaries and expenses of the county weed board; and the county weed
24 control officer, the ~~expense~~ expenses of noxious weed control or eradication
25 along public highways in the county, and any other expenses incurred in the

21 to the commissioner. Upon approval of the voucher and documentation by the
22 commissioner, the office of management and budget shall make the payment out
23 of funds appropriated for the control or eradication of noxious weeds.

9 may request additional time from the city weed board. The notice must state that
10 the landowner may be subject to the penalties provided in section 63-01.1-15 if the

12 A copy of the notice may be sent by certified mail to any tenant, lessee, or operator
13 of the land. If the city weed board will control the noxious weeds upon failure of the

2 dumping on land or in water ~~of~~ any material containing noxious weed seeds or
3 propagating parts is prohibited unless ~~such~~ the material has been processed or
4 treated, or unless it is buried sufficiently deep ~~deeply enough~~ to destroy the seeds

16 a warranty of any kind as to the quality of the gravel, sand, or hay produced from
17 an inspected and certified location. The only representation made is that land from
18 which sand and gravel is surface mined or land producing hay for sale or resale
19 has been inspected for noxious weed contamination ~~by noxious weeds~~ under rules
20 adopted by the commissioner.

5 expenses charged against the land. These expenses are part of the taxes to be
6 levied against the land for the ensuing year and must be collected in the same
7 manner as other real estate taxes. If the city weed board intends to control or
8 eradicate the pests, the notice must include a statement informing the landowner
9 that the landowner may request that the city weed board not control or eradicate
10 the pests. If the landowner requests that the city weed board not control or
11 eradicate the pests, the board may not control or eradicate the pests until the city
12 weed board, by a majority vote, authorizes the control or eradication.

13 **SECTION 35.** A new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14 created and enacted as follows:

15 **Publicly owned land - Pest control or eradication.**

- 16 1. The commissioner shall attempt to arrange a pest control or eradication program
17 with all state and federal agencies owning, controlling, or having jurisdiction over
18 land within the state.
- 19 2. Except as provided in subsection 3, a county weed control officer shall attempt to
20 arrange a pest control or eradication program with all political subdivisions owning
21 or controlling public land within the county weed control officer's jurisdiction.
- 22 3. If a city has a pest control or eradication program, the city weed control officer shall
23 attempt to arrange a pest control or eradication program with all political
24 subdivisions owning or controlling public land within the corporate limits of the city.
- 25 4. Each state agency shall provide for the control or eradication of pests on any land
26 within the agency's jurisdiction. If a state agency fails to control or eradicate pests
27 on land under its jurisdiction, the county weed board for the county in which all or a
28 portion of the land is located, upon approval of the commissioner, may enter upon
29 the land to control or eradicate the pests. The state agency shall reimburse the
30 county weed board for expenses incurred in the control or eradication of pests
31 within thirty days after the agency receives the bill.

- 1 5. Each federal agency shall develop a management plan for controlling or
2 eradicating pests on land within the agency's jurisdiction. If a federal agency does
3 not control or eradicate pests and does not develop a management plan for
4 controlling or eradicating pests, the county weed control officer shall notify the
5 agency as provided in section 63-01.1-08. The federal agency shall provide a
6 report to the control authority detailing the methods used by the federal agency and
7 showing cause why the federal agency is not controlling or eradicating the pests.
8 The commissioner may specify the forms on which the federal agency report must
9 be submitted.
- 10 6. Upon being notified by a county weed board of a federal agency's failure to control
11 or eradicate pests, the commissioner may hold a public hearing to determine the
12 reason for the agency's failure.

13 **SECTION 36. AMENDMENT.** Section 63-01.1-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 **63-01.1-15. Penalties.**

- 16 1. A custom or commercial operator of tillage, seeding, and harvesting equipment
17 who violates subsection 2 of section 63-01.1-12 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.
18 A control authority may institute necessary criminal actions under this subsection.
- 19 2. Persons failing to comply with the rules and notice provisions of this chapter are
20 subject to a civil penalty not to exceed fifty dollars per day for each day of violation,
21 subject to a maximum penalty of two thousand five hundred dollars per year. The
22 accumulated penalties under this section are a lien against the property of the
23 landowner from the day the notice is delivered to the landowner under section
24 63-01.1-08.
- 25 3. a. All penalties collected pursuant to this section must be deposited with the
26 treasurer of the political subdivision and credited to the weed control and
27 eradication fund in the political subdivision in which the penalty originated.
- 28 **Penalties**
- 29 b. All penalties collected pursuant to this section for failure or refusal to ~~perform~~
30 ~~remedial requirements for the control of~~ or eradicate pests ~~on an infested~~
31 area must be credited to the weed control and eradication fund in the political

1 subdivision in which the penalty originated but dedicated for use ~~by the county~~
2 ~~weed board to~~ in the control or eradication of pests. The penalty may be
3 adjudicated by ~~the courts~~ a court or by ~~the~~ a county or a city weed board after
4 a hearing.

5 4. An aggrieved landowner may appeal the imposition of a penalty by ~~the~~ a county
6 weed board to the board of county commissioners and may appeal the imposition
7 of a penalty by a city weed board to the city council.

8 **SECTION 37. REPEAL.** Section 63-01.1-04.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9 repealed.
