1 A concurrent resolution urging the National Emergency Medical Services Scope of Practice

2 Model Review Team to reconsider significantly raising the training requirements of emergency

3 medical services providers.

WHEREAS, North Dakota has a predominantly voluntary emergency medical services
workforce; and

6 WHEREAS, emergency medical services volunteers give a substantial amount of their
7 personal time to be on duty twenty-four hours per day seven days a week to render care and to
8 transport the sick and injured, and these volunteers are a vital component of public safety; and
9 WHEREAS, the National Emergency Medical Services Scope of Practice Model would

10 significantly increase the number of training hours required to become an emergency medical

11 technician, eliminate the emergency medical technician intermediate level, and restrict the

12 procedures that a paramedic could perform; and

WHEREAS, increasing the emergency medical services provider's training
 requirements may discourage individuals from volunteering as emergency medical services
 providers;

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
 17 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

18 That the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly urges the National Emergency Medical

19 Services Scope of Practice Model Review Team to reconsider significantly raising the training

- 20 requirements of emergency medical services providers; and
- 21 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the model review team be requested to not

22 eliminate the emergency medical technician intermediate level and to not restrict procedures

23 currently permitted to be performed by paramedics; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward a copy of this
 resolution to each member of the National Emergency Medical Services Scope of Practice
