

**SENATE BILL NO. 2249**

1 A BILL for an Act to provide appropriations to the state board for career and technical education  
2 for a higher education curriculum design and development and a workforce training grant  
3 program.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the  
6 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$8,000,000, or so  
7 much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state board for career and technical education for  
8 the purpose of providing equal payments to Bismarck state college, Lake Region state college,  
9 North Dakota state college of science, and Williston state college for curriculum design and  
10 development relating to workforce needs as determined in collaboration with the department of  
11 commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.

12 **SECTION 2. CURRICULUM DESIGN - USE OF FUNDS.** The funding appropriated in  
13 section 1 of this Act may only be allocated to a higher education institution after the higher  
14 education institution and the department of commerce have agreed upon a plan for curriculum  
15 design and development relating to workforce needs. Each of the higher education institutions  
16 must use a minimum of eighty-five percent of the funding received for curriculum development,  
17 up to ten percent for promotion, and up to five percent for administration.

18 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the  
19 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,000,000, or so  
20 much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state board for career and technical education for  
21 the purpose of providing supplemental workforce training grants to the institutions of higher  
22 education assigned primary responsibility for workforce training in this state, for the biennium  
23 beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
