1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-12-09, subsection 2 of section 23-12-10,
2 and subsection 2 of section 23-12-10.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
3 exemptions from smoking restrictions and local government enforcement of smoking
4 restrictions.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-12-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **23-12-09. Smoking in public places and places of employment - Definitions.** In
9 sections 23-12-09 through 23-12-11, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

- 10 1. "Bar" means a retail alcoholic beverage establishment licensed under chapter 5-02
11 that is devoted to the serving of alcoholic beverages for consumption by guests on
12 the premises and in which the serving of food is only incidental to the consumption
13 of those beverages. The term includes a bar located within a hotel, bowling center,
14 or restaurant that is not licensed primarily or exclusively to sell alcoholic beverages
15 if the bar is in a separately enclosed area.
- 16 2. "Bingo facility" means a business location in which bingo is the primary source of
17 revenue and in which an individual under eighteen years of age is not permitted on
18 the premises.
- 19 3. "Business" means a sole proprietorship, partnership, association, joint venture,
20 corporation, or other business entity, either for profit or not for profit, including retail
21 establishments where goods or services are sold and professional corporations
22 and other entities where professional services are delivered.

- 1 ~~3.~~ 4. "Employee" means an individual who is employed by an employer in consideration
2 for direct or indirect monetary wages or profit, or an individual who volunteers
3 services for an employer.
- 4 ~~4.~~ 5. "Employer" means an individual, business, or the state and its agencies and
5 political subdivisions that employs the services of one or more individuals.
- 6 ~~5.~~ 6. "Enclosed area" means all space between a floor and ceiling that is enclosed on all
7 sides by solid walls or windows, exclusive of doorways, which extend from the floor
8 to the ceiling.
- 9 ~~6.~~ 7. "Health care facility" means any office or institution providing health care services,
10 including a hospital; clinic; ambulatory surgery center; outpatient care facility;
11 nursing, basic, or assisted living facility; and laboratory.
- 12 ~~7.~~ 8. "Health care services" include medical, surgical, dental, vision, chiropractic, and
13 pharmaceutical services.
- 14 ~~8.~~ 9. "Place of employment" means an area under the control of a public or private
15 employer that employees normally frequent during the course of employment,
16 including work areas, auditoriums, classrooms, conference rooms, elevators,
17 employee cafeterias, employee lounges, hallways, meeting rooms, private offices,
18 restrooms, and stairs.
- 19 ~~9.~~ 10. "Public place" means an enclosed area to which the public has access or in which
20 the public is permitted, including a publicly owned building or office, and enclosed
21 areas available to and customarily used by the general public in businesses and
22 nonprofit entities patronized by the public, including bars; bingo facilities; child care
23 facilities subject to licensure by the department of human services, including those
24 operated in private homes when any child cared for under that license is present;
25 convention facilities; educational facilities, both public and private; facilities
26 primarily used for exhibiting a motion picture, stage, drama, lecture, musical recital,
27 or other similar performance; financial institutions; health care facilities; hotels and
28 motels; laundromats; any common areas in apartment buildings, condominiums,
29 mobile home parks, retirement facilities, nursing homes, and other multiple-unit
30 residential facilities; museums, libraries, galleries, and aquariums; polling places;
31 professional offices; public transportation facilities, including buses and taxicabs,

1 and ticket, boarding, and waiting areas of public transit depots; reception areas;
2 restaurants; retail food production and marketing establishments; retail service
3 establishments; retail stores; rooms, chambers, places of meeting or public
4 assembly, including school buildings; service lines; shopping malls; sports arenas,
5 including enclosed places in outdoor arenas; theaters; and waiting rooms.

6 ~~40.~~ 11. "Publicly owned building or office" means a place owned, leased, or rented by any
7 state or political subdivision, or by any agency supported by appropriation of, or by
8 contracts or grants from, funds derived from the collection of taxes.

9 ~~44.~~ 12. "Restaurant" includes every building or other structure, or any part thereof, and all
10 buildings in connection therewith that are kept, used, maintained, advertised, or
11 held out to the public as a place where food is served, including coffee shops,
12 cafeterias, private and public school cafeterias, kitchens, and catering facilities in
13 which food is prepared on the premises for serving elsewhere, and a bar area
14 within a restaurant.

15 ~~42.~~ 13. "Retail tobacco store" means a retail store utilized primarily for the sale of tobacco
16 products and accessories and in which the sale of other products is merely
17 incidental.

18 ~~43.~~ 14. "Shopping mall" means an enclosed public walkway or hall area that serves to
19 connect retail or professional businesses.

20 ~~44.~~ 15. "Smoking" means possessing a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, weed, plant, or any
21 other lighted tobacco product in any manner or in any form.

22 ~~45.~~ 16. "Sports arena" means any facility or area, whether enclosed or outdoor, where
23 members of the public assemble to engage in physical exercise, participate in
24 athletic competition, or witness sports or other events, including sports pavilions,
25 stadiums, gymnasiums, health spas, boxing arenas, swimming pools, roller and ice
26 rinks, and bowling centers.

27 ~~46.~~ 17. "Truckstop" means a roadside service station and restaurant that caters to
28 truckdrivers.

29 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 23-12-10 of the North Dakota
30 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

31 2. The following areas are exempt from subsection 1:

- 1 a. Private residences, except when operating as a child care facility subject to
2 licensure by the department of human services and when any child cared for
3 under that license is present in that facility.
- 4 b. Hotel and motel rooms, and other places of lodging, that are rented to guests
5 and are designated as smoking rooms.
- 6 c. Retail tobacco stores, provided that smoke from these places does not
7 infiltrate into areas where smoking is prohibited under this section.
- 8 d. Outdoor areas of places of employment, except a sports arena.
- 9 e. Any area that is not commonly accessible to the public and which is part of an
10 owner-operated business having no employee other than the owner-operator.
- 11 f. Bars.
- 12 g. Any place of public access rented or leased for private functions from which
13 the general public and children are excluded and arrangements for the
14 function are under the control of the function sponsor.
- 15 h. Separately enclosed areas in truckstops which are accessible only to adults.
- 16 i. Bingo facilities.

17 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 23-12-10.2 of the North Dakota
18 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 19 2. A city or county ordinance, a city or county home rule charter, or an ordinance
20 adopted under a home rule charter may not provide for ~~less~~ more stringent
21 provisions than those provided under sections 23-12-09 through 23-12-11.
22 ~~Nothing in this Act shall preempt or otherwise affect any other state or local~~
23 ~~tobacco control law that provides more stringent protection from the hazards of~~
24 ~~environmental tobacco smoke.~~ This subsection does not preclude any city or
25 county from enacting any ordinance containing penal language when otherwise
26 authorized to do so by law.
