- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-34.3-10 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the commission on the status of women; and to provide for transition.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-34.3-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

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54-34.3-10. Commission on the status of women - Appointment - Expenses -

- 7 Duties. There is established a
- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>The</u> commission on the status of women. <u>This commission consists of five is</u>
 9 <u>composed of eight members:</u>
 10 a. Four female members appointed by the governor of which at least one
- member must represent a rural area of the state, at least one member must
 represent an urban area of the state, and at least one member must be an
 enrolled member of a federally recognized North Dakota Indian tribe;
- b. Two female members of the house of representatives, one of whom must be
 selected by the leader representing the majority faction of the house of
 representatives and one of whom must be selected by the leader representing
 the minority faction of the house of representatives; and
- 18c.Two female members of the senate, one of whom must be selected by the19leader representing the majority faction of the senate and one of whom must20be selected by the leader representing the minority faction of the senate.
- 2. The governor shall appoint each member for a term of office is four years,
 staggered so that the term of at least one member expires July first of each year
 expiring as of August first with no more than two terms expiring in any one year.
 Of the first members appointed, two members must be appointed for terms of one

12		<u>as v</u>	<u>ice ch</u>	airman of the commission. The state department of health shall provide
13		staff	fservio	ces for the commission. The commission shall meet at least four times
14		per	year a	nd any additional meetings as the chairman determines necessary.

25				facilities, and opportunities, and provide consultant help to local
26				organizations created for the purpose of coordinating activities for the
27				economic and career development of women.;

29				children;
30			<u>(3)</u>	Child care issues;

2	<u>b.</u>	Explore state, regional, and national conferences that would provide				
3		information of interest for women of the state.				
4	<u>C.</u>	Encourage interest, participation, and cooperation with state departments,				
5		agencies, and other organizations in developing needed services, facilities,				
6		and opportunities for the women of the state.				
7	<u>d.</u>	Provide consultant help to local women's organizations created for the				
8		purpose of coordinating activities for the women of the state.				
9	<u>e.</u>	Prepare and present a report to the legislative council by June first of each				
10		even-numbered year on the activities of the commission and any				
11		recommendations for legislation the commission may have that would support				
12		and assist women's issues in the state.				
13 SECTION 2. TRANSITION. Notwithstanding the length of term to which a member of						
14	4 the commission on July 30, 2009, was appointed, the term of each member of the commission					
15	on the status of women is deemed to be expired as of August 1, 2009. Members of the					
16	commission who meet the qualifications set forth in section 1 of this Act may be appointed to					
17	the commission for terms commencing after July 31, 2009.
