4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-12-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

23-12-10. Smoking restrictions - Exceptions - Retaliation - Application.

- In order to protect the public health and welfare and to recognize the need for
 individuals to breathe smoke-free air, smoking is prohibited in all enclosed areas
 of:
- 11 a. Public places; and
- 12 b. Places of employment.
- 13 2. The following areas are exempt from subsection 1:
- 14a.Private residences, except when operating as a child care facility subject to15licensure by the department of human services and when any child cared for16under that license is present in that facility.
- b. Hotel and motel rooms, and other places of lodging, that are rented to guests
 and are designated as smoking rooms.
- e. Retail tobacco stores, provided that smoke from these places does not
 infiltrate into areas where smoking is prohibited under this section.
- 21 d. <u>c.</u> Outdoor areas of places of employment, except a sports arena.
- e. <u>d.</u> Any area that is not commonly accessible to the public and which is part of an
 owner-operated business having no employee other than the owner-operator.

11	5.	This	s section may not be interpreted or construed to permit smoking where it is
12		othe	erwise restricted by other applicable laws.
13	6.	Bef	ore October 1, 2007, the <u>The</u> office of management and budget shall develop
14		and	implement a uniform policy regarding smoking restrictions with respect to the
15		outo	door areas near the public entrances of all buildings on the state capitol
16		grou	unds.
