SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 58-03-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **58-03-12.** Basis for township zoning regulations and restrictions. The regulations 4 and restrictions established in any township zoning district must be made in accordance with a 5 comprehensive plan with reasonable consideration as to the character of such the district, its 6 peculiar suitability for particular uses, the normal growth of the municipality, and the various 7 types of occupations, industries, and land uses within the area, and must be designed to 8 facilitate traffic movement, encourage orderly growth and development of the municipality and 9 adjacent areas, promote health, safety, and general welfare, and provide for emergency 10 management. "Emergency management" means a comprehensive integrated system at all 11 levels of government and in the private sector which provides for the development and 12 maintenance of an effective capability to mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from 13 known and unforeseen hazards or situations, caused by an act of nature or man, which may 14 threaten, injure, damage, or destroy lives, property, or our environment. The comprehensive 15 plan must be a statement in documented text setting forth explicit goals, objectives, policies, 16 and standards of the jurisdiction to guide public and private development within its control. 17 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 61-16.1-10 of the North Dakota 18 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 19 Exercise jointly with other water resource districts within a river basin to effectively 3.

jurisdiction of the county board of drainage commissioners, with or without modification, as a
watercourse or channel to provide a water supply for the city or water resource district, may
make application therefor for use of the drain to the board of drain commissioners of the county
