1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the office of the 2 adjutant general; to amend and reenact subdivision c of subsection 2 of section 37-17.1-07.1 3 and sections 37-28-02 and 37-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hazardous 4 chemical fees, the definition of foreign service and period of service, and payment of adjusted 5 compensation for domestic and foreign service; to amend and reenact section 6 of chapter 17 6 of the 2005 Session Laws, as amended by section 10 of chapter 42 of the 2007 Session Laws, 7 relating to payment of adjusted compensation for veterans; to provide a statement of legislative 8 intent; to provide an appropriation; to provide for transfers; to provide an exemption; and to 9 declare an emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the office of the adjutant general for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows:

1	SEC		N 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision c of subsection 2 of section 37-17.1-07.1 of
2	the North D	akota	a Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
3		c.	Each owner and operator of a facility, as defined in SARA title III, shall pay an
4			annual hazardous chemicals fee to the division of homeland security by
5			March first of each year. The fee is twenty-five dollars for each chemical
6			within the meaning of 40 CFR 355.20 or its successor which is required under
7			section 312 of SARA title III, to be listed on the hazardous chemical inventory
8			form (tier II) which the owner or operator must submit to the division. The
9			federal requirements must be used for completing the tier II form, including
10			the threshold amounts, as outlined in 40 CFR 370.20. The maximum fee for a
11			facility under this section is one hundred fifty four hundred seventy-five
12			dollars. The division of homeland security shall transfer to the county
13			hazardous chemicals preparedness and response account one-half of the
14			funds collected from the state's hazardous chemicals fee system.

17			the United States at any time during the period of service, or active	
18			component member awarded the expeditionary medal or campaign badge for	
19			service after December 5, 1992, who was a resident of the state of North	
20			Dakota, and who has not received bonus or adjusted compensation from	
21			another state for the period of service.

25	5 Each national guard or reserve component resident veteran mobilized stateside is entitled to			
26	6 fifty dollars for each month or major fraction thereof for domestic service, not to exceed nine			
27	hundred do	llars .	Each national guard, reserve, or active component resident veteran of foreign	
28	service who received the expeditionary medal or campaign badge is entitled to one hundred			
29	9 dollars for each month or major fraction thereof, not to exceed one thousand eight hundred			
30	0 dollars. Combined totals for stateside and foreign service may not exceed one thousand eight			
31	hundred do	llars .	If the veteran received a purple heart for foreign service, the veteran is entitled	

to a payment of two thousand five hundred dollars in lieu of monthly payments for adjusted
compensation related to the mobilization during which the purple heart was earned. If the
veteran is deceased, the veteran's beneficiary is entitled to any payments under this chapter to
which the veteran would have been entitled. Applications for adjusted compensation may be
filed with the adjutant general through June 30, 2009 2011, or in the case of a soldier mobilized
on June 30, 2009 2011, not later than six months after the end of the mobilization period of
service.

8 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 6 of chapter 17 of the 2005 Session Laws, as 9 amended by section 10 of chapter 42 of the 2007 Session Laws, is amended and reenacted as 10 follows:

SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - TRANSFER. Any unexpended general fund appropriation authority relating to the \$5,000,000 appropriated in section 3 of this Act for the payment of adjusted compensation to veterans is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation must be transferred to the veterans' cemetery trust fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009 2011, and ending June 30, 2011 2013.

SECTION 6. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO
 SIXTY-SECOND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time
 funding items approved by the sixtieth legislative assembly for the 2007-09 biennium and the
 2009-11 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

30 The 2009-11 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

31 2011-13 biennium. The adjutant general shall report to the appropriations committees of the

1 sixty-second legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

2 beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

3 SECTION 7. VETERANS' CEMETERY MAINTENANCE FUND - APPROPRIATION. 4 In addition to the amount appropriated to the adjutant general in the veterans' cemetery line 5 item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, there is appropriated any additional funds which 6 are received and deposited in the veterans' cemetery maintenance fund pursuant to sections 7 37-03-14 and 39-04-10.10 for the operation of the North Dakota veterans' cemetery for the 8 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

9 SECTION 8. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - TRANSFERS. The adjutant general may
 10 transfer from the deferred maintenance line to the capital assets line, contained in subdivision 1
 11 of section 1 of this Act, amounts necessary to address extraordinary repair needs. Any
 12 amounts transferred must be reported to the director of the office of management and budget.

SECTION 9. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS - TRANSFERS. The adjutant general may transfer to the operating expenses and capital assets line items contained in section 1 of this Act up to the sum of \$500,000 from the various other line items contained in section 1 of this Act, as determined necessary by the adjutant general to provide for the maintenance and repair of state-owned armories in this state during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. Any amounts transferred pursuant to this section must be reported to the director of the office of management and budget.

SECTION 10. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the computer-aided dispatch project, as contained in subdivision 2 of section 3 of chapter 42 of the 2007 Session Laws, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds from these appropriations or related revenues are available and may be expended during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

SECTION 11. EMERGENCY. Section 3 of this Act and the appropriation for capital
 projects of \$450,000 in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
 measure.
