ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1017

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the game and fish
2 department; and to amend and reenact subsection 5 of section 20.1-17-01 of the North Dakota
3 Century Code, relating to agency rules adopted under the Nonindigenous Aquatic Nuisance
4 Prevention and Control Act.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
7 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish fund in
8 the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal
9 funds and other income, to the game and fish department for the purpose of defraying the
10 expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011,
11 as follows:

6 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 5 of section 20.1-17-01 of the North Dakota
7 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 8 5. Develop rules to prevent the movement of aquatic nuisance species into or within
9 the state. In addition to requirements under chapter 28-32, the department shall
10 conduct a cost-benefit analysis for any rule proposed for adoption under this
11 chapter.
