- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 corrections and rehabilitation; to provide for payment of correctional officer training expenses
- 3 by other agencies; to provide contingent appropriations; and to declare an emergency.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purposes of defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows:

## 20 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

- 21 SIXTY-SECOND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time
- 22 funding items approved by the sixtieth legislative assembly for the 2007-09 biennium and the
- 23 2009-11 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

- 6 The 2009-11 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
- 7 2011-13 biennium. The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall report to the
- 8 appropriations committees of the sixty-second legislative assembly on the use of this one-time
- 9 funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

**SECTION 3. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - TRANSFERS.** The department of corrections and rehabilitation is authorized to transfer from the deferred maintenance line to the other lines contained in section 1 of this Act amounts necessary to address extraordinary repair needs. Any amounts transferred must be reported to the director of the office of management and budget.

SECTION 4. Payment of correctional officer training costs. Any state agency, institution, or department that hires a correctional officer from the department of corrections and rehabilitation shall pay to the department of corrections and rehabilitation fifteen percent of the cost of training a new correctional officer. This section applies only to correctional officers who are hired by another agency and who had been employed by the department of corrections and rehabilitation for one year or less.

SECTION 5. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION SHARE OF SALARY EQUITY POOL. The office of management and budget shall provide at least twenty-nine percent of any general fund salary equity pool that is appropriated for salary equity increases for state employees, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation. The department of corrections and rehabilitation may provide salary equity increases only to employees classified in pay grades one through fourteen.

SECTION 6. CONTINGENT FUNDING - MISSOURI RIVER CORRECTIONAL

CENTER REPAIRS. Section 1 of this Act includes \$93,592 from the general fund for roof repairs for the dining and kitchen area at the Missouri River correctional center which may be spent only if the Missouri River correctional center is not relocated to the state penitentiary as

1 part of the prison expansion project, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending 2 June 30, 2011. 3 SECTION 7. HEART OF AMERICA CORRECTION AND TREATMENT CENTER. 4 The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall distribute, in twenty-four equal payments, 5 the sum of \$1,628,813 from the general fund appropriated in the adult services line item in 6 section 1 of this Act to the heart of America correction and treatment center for inmate-related 7 treatment services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 8 SECTION 8. CONTINGENT FUNDING - PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS. Section 1 of 9 this Act includes \$225,041 for a summer replacement boiler, \$18,928 for conversion of the 10 energy management system from analog to digital, \$15,774 for heating and cooling equipment 11 replacement, and \$160,000 for temporary housing of sexual offenders from the general fund 12 which may be spent only to the extent that federal funds appropriated in section 9 of this Act 13 are not available for these purposes. 14 SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FISCAL STIMULUS FUNDS -ADDITIONAL FUNDING APPROVAL. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 15 16 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from federal funds made available to the state 17 under the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, not otherwise 18 appropriated, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the period beginning with 19 the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2011, as follows: 20 Summer replacement boiler \$225,041 21 (from funds available through department of commerce) 22 18,928 Energy management system conversion 23 (from funds available through department of commerce) 24 Heating and cooling equipment replacement 15,574 25 (from funds available through department of commerce) 26 160,000 Temporary housing of sexual offenders 27 (from funds available through department of commerce) 28 Crime victims assistance 542,000 29 Crime victims compensation 78,313

## Sixty-first Legislative Assembly

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- The department of corrections and rehabilitation may seek emergency commission and budget section approval under chapter 54-16 for authority to spend any additional federal funds received under the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 in excess of the amounts appropriated in this section, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2011.
- Any federal funds appropriated under this section are not a part of the agency's 2011-13 base budget. Any program expenditures made with these funds will not be replaced with state funds after the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds are no longer available.
- SECTION 10. EMERGENCY. Section 9 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
