HB 1414: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 39-04-10.14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the issuance of special plates for surviving family members of fallen members of the United States military.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

Reps. Wald, Grande, Klemin, Skarphol and Sens. Cook, Dever introduced:

HB 1415: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 28-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to making the state auditor and board of university and school lands administrative agencies for purposes of the Administrative Agencies Practice Act.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Reps. Dahl, Delmore, Klemin and Sens. Freborg, Holmberg, Nelson introduced:

HB 1416: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 12-60-08.1 and a new subsection to section 12-60-16.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the power of the attorney general to issue administrative subpoenas for bureau investigations and the duty of criminal justice agencies to enter warrants into the central warrant information system; and to amend and reenact subsections 1, 2, 3, 9, and 12 of section 12.1-32-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to registration requirements for sexual offenders and offenders against children.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Reps. Wald, Onstad, Ruby and Sens, Klein, Olafson, Warner introduced:

HB 1417: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 32-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the liability of persons working with liquefied petroleum gas; to provide for application; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Reps. Hawken, Martinson, Mueller and Sens. Fiebiger, Krebsbach, Wardner introduced:

HB 1418: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood care workforce development, child care capacity, and department of human services establishment of a quality improvement rating system for early childhood care facilities.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

Reps. Wieland, Froseth, Pollert, Weiler and Sens. Cook, Fischer introduced:

HB 1419: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-27.2-01 and 54-27.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the maximum balance of and transfers to the budget stabilization fund; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Appropriations Committee**.

Reps. Frantsvog, Hofstad, Nathe and Sen. Anderson introduced:

HB 1420: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 40-40-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to certified copies of the municipal levy and final budget being sent to the county auditor.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Reps. Thorpe, Griffin, Hawken, N. Johnson and Sens. Schneider, Wanzek introduced:

HB 1421: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 13-08-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees for deferred presentment services; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

HCR 3010: A concurrent resolution to create and enact a new section to article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota, relating to freedom of choice in health care.

Was read the first time and referred to the Constitutional Revision Committee.

HCR 3011: A concurrent resolution endorsing the concept, implementation, and funding of regional capability response to manmade and natural disasters in North Dakota.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Reps. Kerzman, Froelich and Sens. Krauter, Warner introduced:

HCR 3012: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of encouraging the use of generic prescription drugs.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.
