Page 8, replace lines 21 through 25 with:

"5. If any law enforcement personnel or duly authorized representative of the state fire marshal discovers any cigarettes for which no certification has been filed as required by section 18-13-03, or which have not been marked as required by section 18-13-04, that personnel or representative may seize and take possession of the cigarettes. Cigarettes seized under this subsection must be destroyed; provided, however, that before the destruction of the cigarettes, the true holder of the trademark rights in the cigarette brand is permitted to inspect the cigarette."

Page 8, line 28, replace "injunctive relief or to" with ":

- a. Preliminary or permanent injunctive relief against any manufacturer, importer, wholesale dealer, retail dealer, agent, or any other person to enjoin the person from selling, offering to sell, or affixing tax stamps to any cigarette that does not comply with the requirements of this chapter; or
- <u>b. To</u>"

Page 8, line 30, after the underscored period insert:

"<u>7.</u>"

Page 9, line 31, after "DATE" insert " - EXPIRATION DATE" and after "2010" insert ", however, this Act becomes ineffective on the date the state fire marshal certifies to the legislative council that a federal reduced cigarette ignition propensity standard has been adopted and has become effective"
