- 4. The board or board search committee may enter an executive session under section 44-04-19.2 to consider or discuss an exempt record or the identity of an applicant or candidate whose records are exempt under this section."

The commissioner serves at the pleasure of the governor and receives a salary set by the governor within the limits of legislative appropriations. The commissioner:

- 1. Shall file an oath of office in the usual form before commencing to perform the duties of the commissioner;
- 2. Shall serve as chairman of the cabinet;
- 3. Shall prepare the cabinet's list identifying economic development moneys included in budget requests of cabinet agencies;
- Shall appoint personnel as may be determined necessary to carry out the duties of the department;
- 5. <u>4.</u> Shall manage the operations of the department and oversee each of the divisions;
- 6. <u>5.</u> Shall assume central responsibilities to develop, implement, and coordinate a working network of commerce service providers;
- 7. <u>6.</u> Shall coordinate the department's services with commerce-related services of other state agencies;
- 8. 7. Shall advise and cooperate with departments and agencies of the federal government and of other states; private businesses, agricultural organizations, and associations; research institutions; and with any individual or other private or public entity;
- 9. 8. May enter contracts upon terms and conditions as determined by the commissioner to be reasonable and to effectuate the purposes of this chapter;
- 10. 9. Shall report between the first and tenth legislative days of each regular legislative session to a standing committee of each house of the legislative assembly as determined by the legislative council and shall report annually to the foundation:
