REMARKS OF MISS NORTH DAKOTA, TESSIE JONES

Good afternoon legislators! Thank you for having me today; it is an honor to address you. It has been a privilege and a blessing to represent our wonderful state this year. I wanted the job so much that I ran for Miss North Dakota four times before earning the title.

I have traveled across the state and back from my home town of West Fargo this year, and also to Florida, California, and Nevada to take part in Miss America activities. They may have the warm weather, but I have always looked forward to coming home. I attended the Fargo Film Festival this past weekend and a visiting filmmaker from Spain said it best: "You have some very cold weather here, but the people are very warm." I have found this to be true all year long, and in my interaction with people from every state in the nation this year, I can say that North Dakotans are second to none.

We have some of the kindest, warmest, most hardworking individuals with integrity and sincerity. Not to mention brave, from our soldiers overseas, to my fellow Miss North Dakota 1997 Roxana Saberi, the journalist who is currently detained in Iran. Please continue to keep these individuals in your thoughts and prayers as I have.

I admire the positions each of you hold, and I know your jobs, like mine, are ones of service. Matthew 23:11 states, "He who is greatest among you shall be your servant." I'm sure you have learned, as I have, that the greatest achievements in life are those that serve others. The way I have best found to serve my state is by promoting an idea I call "Life Awareness: Improving Mental Health & Preventing Suicide."

When I was 16, I got into my first car accident on New Year's Eve and went to work feeling sorry for myself, but was in for a rude awakening. Upon arriving, I was informed that a co-worker of mine had attempted suicide over Christmas. This girl was a classmate of mine, my same age. Unfortunately hers is not an isolated event. North Dakota has the second highest suicide rate in the nation for people ages 15-24.

I travel to schools across the state and have spoken to almost 4,000 students thus far about suicide so that they may see warning signs in those around them and seek help for those individuals or themselves. I have numerous encounters with young people who have

approached me with their own stories of depression and suicidal thoughts. I know this all too well, as someone close to me had been suicidal for quite some time and attempted twice in my presence. But this person is still with us, and that is my hope for our youth--that they can hold on through the difficult times to harness the potential we know they have.

As you know, the Mental Health Parity bill was passed this past year in Congress, which treats mental illness the same as physical illness. I encourage you to continue to support this idea at the state level and support such crucial and life-saving organizations like Mental Health America of North Dakota and the North Dakota Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, two organizations I have had the privilege of working with.

Thank you again for the work that you do, and I applaud you for making North Dakota one of the strongest economies in our nation. I don't think it's quite as hard as modeling a swimsuit in front of thousands, but difficult nonetheless. Thank you and God bless!
