- Page 1, line 15, replace the first "<u>or</u>" with an underscored comma and after "<u>health</u>" insert "<u>, or</u> <u>the state board of animal health</u>"
- Page 1, line 17, replace "<u>or</u>" with an underscored comma and after "<u>health</u>" insert "<u>, or the state</u> <u>board of animal health</u>"
- Page 1, line 21, replace "<u>or</u>" with an underscored comma and after the second "<u>health</u>" insert ", <u>or the state veterinarian</u>"

Page 3, line 24, after "health" insert "or the state board of animal health"

Page 4, line 5, after "health" insert "or the state board of animal health"

Page 6, line 30, after the first "health" insert "or the state board of animal health"

Page 9, replace lines 13 through 26 with:

- "1. A volunteer health practitioner who is injured as the result of providing health or veterinary services under this chapter is deemed to be an employee of this state for the purpose of receiving benefits for the death or injury under title 65 if:
 - a. The practitioner is not otherwise eligible for benefits for the injury or death under the law of this or another state; and
 - b. The practitioner or, in the case of death, the practitioner's personal representative elects coverage under the workers' compensation law of this state by making a claim under that law.
- 2. In this section, "injury" means a compensable injury as defined under section 65-01-02.
- 3. Workforce safety and insurance shall adopt rules, enter agreements with other states as is practicable, or take other measures to facilitate the receipt of benefits for injury or death under title 65 by volunteer health practitioners who reside in other states."

4. Nothing in this chapter prevents the employment of social work designees by hospitals, basic care facilities, or skilled nursing facilities, provided these persons individuals work under the direction of a social worker or social work consultant licensed under this chapter and that the board be notified of the name of the designee's employer and the name of the licensee who is providing direction or consultation to the designees." "**SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 43-41-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

 The governor shall appoint the North Dakota board of social work examiners which must consist of six members, two of whom must be, at the time of initial appointment, licensed social workers; one of whom must be, at the time of initial appointment, a licensed certified social worker; one of whom must be, at the time of initial appointment, a licensed independent clinical social worker; and two of whom must be laypersons. Board members must demonstrate no conflict of interest."
