- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to abstinence-based concepts within the school health curriculum.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

6 Abstinence-based concepts - Health curriculum.

- 7 Beginning July 1, 2012, each school district shall ensure that its curriculum for health
- 8 includes the exposure of students to abstinence-based concepts, including that:
- 9 <u>1.</u> There are social, psychological, and health gains to be realized by abstaining from
 10 sexual activity;
- 11 <u>2.</u> <u>Abstinence is the expected standard for all students;</u>
- 12 <u>3.</u> Abstinence is the only certain way to avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy, sexually
- 13 transmitted disease, and other associated health problems;
- <u>A mutually faithful monogamous relationship within the context of marriage is the</u>
 <u>expected standard of human sexual activity:</u>
- 16 <u>5.</u> <u>Sexual activity outside the context of marriage is likely to have harmful psychological</u>
 17 <u>and physical effects;</u>
- 18 <u>6.</u> Bearing children out of wedlock is likely to have harmful consequences for the child,
 19 the child's parents, and society;
- 20 <u>7.</u> <u>There are ways to reject unwanted sexual advances;</u>
- 21 8. Alcohol and drug use increase one's vulnerability to sexual advances; and
- 22 <u>9.</u> It is important to attain economic self-sufficiency before engaging in sexual activity.
