- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 43-15-35 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to permits to operate pharmacies.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-15-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 43-15-35. Requirements for permit to operate pharmacy - Exceptions.

- 7 4. The board shall issue a permit to operate a pharmacy, or a renewal permit, upon
- 8 satisfactory proof of all of the following:
- 9 a.<u>1.</u> The pharmacy will be conducted in full compliance with existing laws and with the
 10 rules and regulations established<u>adopted</u> by the board.
- 11 b.2. The equipment and facilities of the pharmacy are such that prescriptions can be filled
- 12 accurately and properly, and United States pharmacopeia and national formulary
- 13 preparations properly compounded and so that it may be operated and maintained in a
- 14 manner that will not endanger public health and safety.
- 15 c.3. The pharmacy is equipped with proper pharmaceutical and sanitary appliances and
 16 kept in a clean, sanitary, and orderly manner.
- 17 d.<u>4.</u> The management of the pharmacy is under the personal charge of a pharmacist duly
 18 licensed under the laws of this state.
- 19 e.<u>5.</u> The applicant for such permit is qualified to conduct the pharmacy, and is a licensed-
- 20 pharmacist in good standing or is a partnership, each active member of which is a
- 21 licensed pharmacist in good standing; a corporation or an association, the majority-
- 22 stock in which is owned by licensed pharmacists in good standing; or a limited liability-
- 23 company, the majority membership interests in which is owned by licensed-

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1		pha	armacists in good standing, actively and regularly employed in and responsible for
2		the	management, supervision, and operation of such pharmacy.
3	f.<u>6.</u>	Suitable reference sources either in book or electronic data form, are available in the	
4		pha	armacy or online, which might include the United States pharmacopeia and national
5		forr	nulary, the United States pharmacopeia dispensing information, facts and
6		con	nparisons, micro medex, the American society of health-system pharmacists
7		forr	nulary, or other suitable references pertinent to the practice carried on in the
8		licensed pharmacy.	
9	2.	The	e provisions of subdivision e of subsection 1 do not apply to:
10		a.	The holder of a permit on July 1, 1963, if otherwise qualified to conduct the
11			pharmacy, provided that any such permitholder that discontinues operations
12			under such permit or fails to renew such permit upon expiration is not exempt
13			from the provisions of subdivision e of subsection 1 as to the discontinued or
14			lapsed permit.
15		b.	A hospital pharmacy furnishing service only to patients in that hospital.
16		C.	The applicant for a permit to operate a pharmacy which is a hospital, if the
17			pharmacy for which the hospital seeks a permit to operate is a retail pharmacy
18			that is the sole provider of pharmacy services in the community and is a retail-
19			pharmacy that was in existence before the hospital took over operations. A
20			hospital operating a pharmacy under this subdivision may operate the pharmacy
21			at any location in the community.
22		d.	The applicant for a permit to operate a pharmacy which is the owner of a
23			postgraduate medical residency training program if the pharmacy is collocated
24			with and is run in direct conjunction with the postgraduate medical residency-
25			training program. For purposes of this subdivision, the postgraduate medical-
26			residency training program must be accredited by the accreditation council on-
27			graduate medical education or other national accrediting organization.
