- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to electronic drug prior authorization standards; and to provide for a
- 3 report to the legislative management.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

7 <u>Electronic drug prior authorization and transmission - Limitations.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> Effective August 1, 2013, a drug prior authorization request must be accessible to a
- 9 <u>health care provider with the provider's electronic prescribing software system and</u>
- 10 <u>must be accepted electronically, through a secure electronic transmission, by the</u>
- 11 payer, by the insurance company, or by the pharmacy benefit manager responsible for
- 12 implementing or adjudicating or for implementing and adjudicating the authorization or
- 13 <u>denial of the prior authorization request. For purposes of this section, a facsimile is not</u>
 14 <u>an electronic transmission.</u>
- 15 <u>2.</u> Effective August 1, 2013, electronic transmission devices used to communicate a
- 16 prescription to a pharmacist may not use any means or permit any other person to use
- 17 <u>any means, including advertising, commercial messaging, and popup advertisements,</u>
- 18 to influence or attempt to influence through economic incentives the prescribing_
- 19 decision of a prescribing practitioner at the point of care. Such means may not be
- 20 <u>triggered by or be in specific response to the input, selection, or act of a prescribing</u>
- 21 practitioner or the prescribing practitioner's staff in prescribing a certain
- 22 pharmaceutical or directing a patient to a certain pharmacy. Any electronic
- 23 <u>communication sent to the prescriber, including advertising, commercial messaging, or</u>
- 24 popup advertisements must be consistent with the product label, supported by

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| 1 | scientific evidence, and meet the federal food and drug administration requirements |
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- 2 <u>for advertising pharmaceutical products.</u>
- 3 3. Electronic prescribing software may show information regarding a payer's formulary if
 4 the software is not designed to preclude or make more difficult the act of a prescribing
 5 practitioner or patient selecting any particular pharmacy or pharmaceutical.

6 SECTION 2. ELECTRONIC DRUG PRIOR AUTHORIZATION STANDARDIZATION AND

7 TRANSMISSION - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. During the 2011-12 interim,

- 8 the health information technology advisory committee shall establish an outline on how best to
- 9 standardize drug prior authorization request transactions between providers and the payers,
- 10 insurance companies, and pharmacy benefit managers responsible for adjudicating the
- 11 authorization or denial of the prescription request. The outline must be designed with the goal of
- 12 maximizing administrative simplification and efficiency in preparation for electronic
- 13 transmissions and alignment with standards that are or will potentially be used nationally. By
- 14 June 30, 2012, the health information technology advisory committee shall provide a report to
- 15 the legislative management regarding the outline on how best to standardize drug prior
- 16 authorization request transactions.
