- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 50-25.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to interviews of children in cases of abuse or neglect.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 50-25.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **50-25.1-05. Assessment.**

- The department, in accordance with rules adopted by the department, immediately
 shall initiate an assessment, or cause an assessment, of any report of child abuse or
- 9 neglect including, when appropriate, the assessment of the home or the residence of
- 10 the child, any school or child care facility attended by the child, and the circumstances
- 11 surrounding the report of abuse or neglect. <u>Unless the report alleges a violation of a</u>
- 12 <u>criminal statute involving sexual or physical abuse, the department may not interview</u>
- 13 the alleged abused or neglected child and any other child who currently resides or who
- 14 has resided with the person responsible for the child's welfare or the alleged
- 15 perpetrator unless the department has the consent of a person responsible for the

16 <u>child's welfare.</u>

- If the report alleges a violation of a criminal statute involving sexual or physical abuse,
 the department and an appropriate law enforcement agency shall coordinate the
 planning and execution of their investigation efforts to avoid a duplication of factfinding
 efforts and multiple interviews. The department or the law enforcement agency may:
- a. Refer the case to a children's advocacy center for a forensic interview, forensic
 medical examination, and other services.
- b. Interview, without the consent of a person responsible for the child's welfare, thealleged abused or neglected child and any other child who currently resides or

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1		who has resided with the person responsible for the child's welfare or the alleged
2		perpetrator. The interview must be recorded electronically.
3		c. Conduct the interview at a school, child care facility, or any other place where the
4		alleged abused or neglected child or other child is found.
5	3.	Except as prohibited under title 42, Code of Federal Regulations, part 2, a regional
6		human service center shall disclose to the department or the department's authorized
7		agent, upon request, the records of a patient or client which are relevant to an
8		assessment of reported child abuse or neglect.
9	4.	The department shall adopt guidelines for case referrals to a children's advocacy
10		center. When cases are referred to a children's advocacy center, all interviews of the
11		alleged abused or neglected child conducted at the children's advocacy center under
12		this section shall be audio-recorded or video-recorded.
