- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 37-14-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 37-14-18. County veterans' service officer Appointment Duties.

The board of county commissioners of each county of thethis state of North Dakota shall appoint, employ, and pay, on a full-time or part-time basis, an officer to be known as a county veterans' service officer. The veterans' affairs commissioner may shall work directly with county veterans' service officers and the board of county commissioners of each county of this state. An individual may serve as a county veterans' service officer in more than one county. The appointment must be made with the prior advice of the commissioner of veterans' affairs, and in accordance with veterans' preference as provided in section 37-19.1-02. By August 1, 2011, allEach In addition to any recommended qualifications or standards made by the commissioner of veterans' affairs to the board of county commissioners and adopted by the board, and any training, certification, and accreditation required by the commissioner of veterans' affairs, to be qualified for the position, a county veterans' service officers officer must be accredited attend training provided by the national association of county veterans' service officers. It is the duty of the The county veterans' service officer to shall become acquainted with the laws, both state and federal, enacted for the benefit of returning servicemen and servicewomen to assist suchreturning members of the armed forces in the presentation, proof, and establishment of suchtheir claims, privileges, and rights as they have. - 4 benefits or services from the department of veterans' affairs or the United States department of
- 5 veterans' affairs, except if the individual is the spouse or an immediate family member of the
- 6 officer, or unless the conservator is appointed by the county under chapter 11-21.
