- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a waiting period for divorce and to mandatory marital counseling.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

6 Divorce proceeding - Waiting period - Mandatory marital counseling.

- 7 <u>1.</u> In an action for divorce which includes the issue of parental rights and responsibilities
- 8 and which does not include substantiated allegations of domestic abuse, the court
- 9 <u>may not issue a final order for at least twelve months from the date of the filing of the</u>
 10 petition.
- 12 <u>2.</u> <u>Within the twelve-month waiting period, the adult parties to the action shall participate</u>
- 12 jointly or separately in at least ten 1-hour marital counseling sessions. The marital
- 13 <u>counseling, which may be provided by a paid or volunteer counselor, clergy member,</u>
- 14 <u>or any state-certified or licensed marriage mediator, must include at least four</u>
- 15 <u>sessions that focus on postmarital financial planning.</u>
- 16 <u>3.</u> The court may not require both parents to attend the same course at the same time.
- 17 Each party shall arrange for participation in the marital counseling sessions. The
- 18 parties are responsible for the fees or costs of the marital counseling sessions. The
- 19 <u>court may assess the counseling fees or costs as the court deems equitable.</u>
- A final decree may not be granted or a final order may not be entered until each party
 submits to the court certification of completion of the marital counseling.
